FEEDING, CLOTHING OF NAVAL RECRUIT

One of the most interesting as well as the most necessary of the activities of a U. S. naval training station is that which has to do with the clothing and subsisting of recruits and other personnel received for training.

The supply officer of the station issues to each man an outfit of clothing, which is given each recruit upon entering the service. This outfit consists of everything from underwear on out to an overcoat, hats, shoes and bedding.

A stock of approximately \$100,000 worth of clothing is kept at the training station to meet clothing needs of the men.

Having been outfitted, the recruit is interested in what he will receive to take the place of those good meals "mother used to make."

The navy department buys only the best food products the market affords and maintains cooking and baking schools to insure the most efficient handling of these products.

The fact that recruits gain from five to ten pounds during 12 weeks of training, and that the "sick admission rate" for these men is exceptionally low, would indicate that their bodily needs are matters of the most careful consideration by the navy.
