DEATH DATE FOR BRUNO FINDS HIM IN HOPEFUL MOOD

Three Slim Chances To Live More Than Month Remain—Unmoved When Advised Of Fateful Day.

TRENTON, N. J., Dec. 14.—(UP)—The chances of Bruno Richard Hauptmann to live more than a month rested on three slim possibilities tonight.

He will be electrocuted in state penitentiary the week of January 13 for the murder of Charles Augustus Lindbergh, Jr., unless:

1. The New Jersey court of pardons commutes his sentence. 2. The courts permit him a new trial on grounds that starting new evidence could be produced.

3. Governor Harold Hoffman grants him a reprieve. The first two were held highly unlikely. Should the governor intercede he could prolong the former German machine-gunner's life three months at the most.

Although the date for his electrocution was set late yesterday by Justice Thomas W. Trenchard, before whom Hauptmann was tried, the prisoner did not learn of it until today.

He exhibited no surprise, and once again, he predicted "something" would save him. Col. Mark Kimberling, chief keeper said: "Kimberling sent an assistant 'out back' to advise Hauptmann. 'Thank you,' the convicted slayer said simply.

"Hauptmann more or less expected to hear the news soon," Kimberling said. "He told the officer that he still expected something would happen and that he could not expect no change in Hauptmann's outlook."
