D. A. R. News

In a letter to the principals of high schools in Oregon, announcing the plan of the D. A. R. 1936 citizenship pilgrimage to Washington, Oregon, in cities where there are D. A. R. chapters established. Rules of the contest, approved by Mrs. Ruth Bryan Owen, honorary chairman, Mrs. William A. Becker, president general, general chairman, and the state committee are as follows: Candidates must be students of the senior classes only. The student body shall select by highest vote three girls, and the faculty shall select one of the three as best representing all requirements and certify name to the state superintendent of public instruction through the principal or superintendent. Final selection of the winner shall be made by lot under the supervision of the state superintendent of public instruction in which a committee of D. A. R. members and any other persons especially desired by the state superintendent and the state regent, shall participate. The name of the final winner thus selected by lot shall be certified to the state regent, D. A. R., by the state superintendent of public instruction. Three girls shall be selected in the order in which they are believed to qualify as excelling in the following qualities: Dependability—Punctuality, truthfulness, loyalty and self-control. Service—Co-operation, courtesy and respect for proper authority and rights of others. Leadership—Imagination, command of the good and will and respect of others, and the bent to lead. Patriotism—Interest and pride in family, school, community and nation, and willingness to sacrifice self for them. The girl making the pilgrimage is not to be penalized for absence from school during the time required for the trip, and must have written consent of her parents or guardian to accept the trip if selected, and abide by all requirements. Lincoln's birthday has been suggested as an appropriate day for announcing the name of the winning girl of each high school, and Washington's birthday for announcing the state winner.

Wednesday Study Club

"The Motives and Results of the Crusades" was the subject of a paper read by Mrs. N. T. Hodges at the Wednesday Study Club's meeting on December 18. With pictures illustrating the subject and a map showing the geographical boundaries of that time and the different routes taken by the crusaders, Mrs. Hodges presented a comprehensive view of political and social life during the Middle Ages. Mrs. West's remarks were made especially interesting by her personal experience of a visit to Palestine a few years ago. To students of this subject, "In the Steps of the Master," by H. V. Morton was recommended. The president, Mrs. B. G. Harding, presided at the meeting, which is the last one of the current year. The next meeting is scheduled for January 15. Mrs. Louis Brown was a guest of the club.
