CHRISTMAS CHEER CAUSES TROUBLE FOR TWO DRIVERS

Too much "Christmas cheer" was the downfall of two Medford men, Walter C. Degerness, 32, and E. W. Anderson, 60, police disclosed today. Degerness pleaded guilty in justice court this morning to a charge of driving an auto while intoxicated Christmas night, and Anderson pleaded guilty in city court on a charge of reckless driving after having been arrested by city police on Christmas Eve after he had rammed three parked cars on West Main street.

State police, who arrested Degerness, stated that in driving from Reddy avenue onto Crater Lake avenue last night, the man had driven over the sidewalk into the house of John Denison. Degerness was fined \$100 and costs of \$4.50, and sentenced to serve 30 days in the county jail. The jail sentence was suspended upon his promise to pay the fine.

City police reported that Anderson struck three parked cars, one belonging to H. D. Kern, one to Peb Stone, and one to F. A. Southland, damaging all three. A physician who examined Anderson pronounced him intoxicated, police said. He will be sentenced Saturday morning by City Judge Allen D. Curry pending his repairing of the damaged machines.

Another auto crash, early Christmas morning, has mystified city police, who found the lamp post at the corner of Riverside avenue and Sixth street knocked flat, with broken glass and blood on the sidewalk, but no trace of the auto which had hit the post, or of its occupants.

A check with hospitals revealed that no one had called there for medical attention, and no report has been made regarding the accident.

O. B. Morrow, 13 Keene way, reported to city police that he had hit the parked car of D. J. Wilcox, parked in front of the Wilcox residence at 1407 East Main street.
