

### BAR EXAMINERS BOARD OVERRULED TO PERMIT ATTORNEYS ADMISSION

SALEM, Jan. 2. (AP)—The Oregon supreme court today overruled the action of the bar examiners in denying admission to the bar of Dr. L. K. Poyntz of Portland. The case, the first of its kind for many years in the state court, was declared by justices "most unusual."

Poyntz, a practicing physician in Portland the past 12 years last May made application to the supreme court for admission to the bar after having passed the regular examinations. The board of bar examiners had refused to admit Poyntz because, the board said, "his moral character was not good."

After application was filed for admission, the board filed a complaint against him, naming four reasons why he should not be admitted. These included allegations that "his reputation among members of his profession is not good," that he had "advised and abetted the Dr. Richard Neubauer in violation of the law relative to sale of narcotics," and that as a professional witness in personal injury cases his findings and testimony "in most cases are wilfully false." These allegations were denied by the applicant.

The opinion, written by Justice Harry Belt, overruled the action of the board and admitted Poyntz to practice, and vindicated him of all charges filed.

### MAE WEST'S MANAGER HELD FOR CONDUCTING INDECENT STAGE SHOW

HOLLYWOOD, Cal., Jan. 2. (AP)—Police raided an alleged indecent stage show early today and arrested James A. Timony, business manager of Mae West, and 14 members of the cast of "Ladies by Request."

After being booked on suspicion of producing an indecent show and suspicion of failure to obtain a fire permit, Timony was released on his own recognizance.

The ten actors and four actresses were booked on suspicion of participating in an indecent performance. Miss West has denied on several occasions that she was lending financial support to her rotund, gray-haired manager in his theatrical venture.

"If I come up to see his show, it's because I'm his friend," said the blonde star.

Timony declined to comment on the case as his trial was set in night court for a week today.

Billed as a farcical drama, "Ladies by Request" deals with the marital trials of two sophisticated couples.

### APPLIGATE SCION DIES IN PORTLAND

PORTLAND, Jan. 2. (AP)—Jesse Applegate, 80, grandson of Jesse Applegate, pioneer and famous figure in early Oregon history, died here Tuesday from a heart attack. He had been ill since December 17.

His grandfather and the latter's two brothers, Charles and Lindsay, crossed the plains to Oregon from Missouri in 1843. Their names rank high in lists of famous Oregon pioneers.

The grandson was born in Yoncalla, where his grandfather is buried. Years ago he owned an abstract office in Jackson county. He later established the Pioneer Employment company in Pendleton and Portland, and for five years was postmaster at Gibbon, Umatilla county.

Jesse Applegate was associated in the abstract business with his father, Peter Applegate, in Jacksonville many years ago, but left this county at an early age. Little available information regarding his career in this section of the state was available today.

### BANWELL SPEAKER AT LIONS MEETING

At the regular weekly meeting of Lions club, held Tuesday at Valentine's, A. H. Banwell was principal speaker, choosing "Aviation in Medford" as his topic. Banwell outlined plans for the new airport expansion here, reviewed the possibilities and probabilities of the city being chosen for the new army air-base, and told the Lions of the progress that has been made in the last several years.

Entertainment was furnished by Eusebe Dallaire, who played three piano numbers, which were very well received. Dallaire is a music student at St. Mary's academy here.

J. M. Howe, newly initiated member, attended his first Lions meeting today. W. P. Dunlap was a guest at the meeting.

It was announced at the meet that the attendance contest will be resumed next week.

### PROTEST OF PIERCE ON STRAW BALLOTS ANSWERED BY DIGEST

NEW YORK, Jan. 2. (AP)—Replying to Representative Walter M. Pierce of Oregon, the Literary Digest today declared its straw ballot "merely disclosed the mind of the voters in advance and does not 'create bellyhoo' or effect one-sided voting in the official balloting."

Announcing his intention to seek to have straw ballots barred from the mails, Rep. Pierce in Washington yesterday asserted, "A straw ballot easily could be planned to throw a majority in a certain way and by creating a band-wagon, get a million votes right off the bat."

"Such a premise," said the Literary Digest in a formal statement, "is contrary to the findings witnessed by poll managers."

The statement continued: "Officials of the magazine state that it seems axiomatic to them that the closeness of their forecasts in the 1924, 1928 and 1932 campaigns is the actual votes of the official election which followed shows that the poll merely disclosed the mind of the voters in advance and does not create 'bellyhoo' or effect one-sided voting in the official balloting."

### SCHOONER PILES UP ON BANDON'S BEACH

BANDON, Ore., Jan. 2. (AP)—The gasoline schooner E. L. Smith, captained by Frank Brock of Bandon, paid mute tribute today to the power of the recent high seas.

The boat swerved into the sand when it struck high waves and heavy wind yesterday while crossing the Bandon bar. Today it lay on the beach, apparently a wreck.

It carried a cargo of lumber and cheese. Captain Brock and a crew of five were removed safely by coast guardsmen. The boat is owned by Brock and Andrew Jackson of Mapleton. Coast guardsmen said the ship was valued at \$7,000.

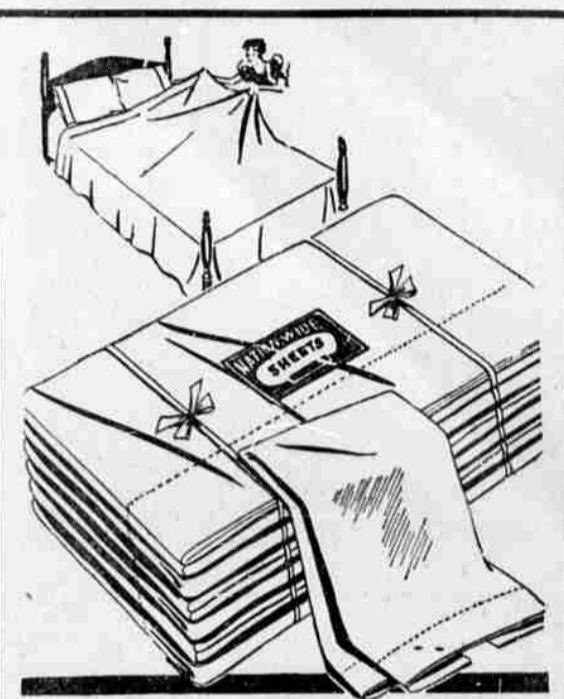
