SUNLIGHT BRINGS WEIGHT TO PLANT SEALED IN GLASS

Scientists Told of Test Tending to Prove Matter Made From Energy - Question Long Debated

By STEPHEN J. McDONOUGH Associated Press Science Writer ST. LOUIS, Mo., Jan. 3.—(AP)—New proof that the energy of sunlight is transformed into solid matter was presented today to the American Association for the Advancement of Science.

Dr. Earle Augustus Spessard of Hendrix college, Conway, Ark., told association members of an experiment in which green plants sealed, so they could contain no plant food, in an airtight glass tube for ten months gained weight as a result of having been exposed to sunlight.

Disputed Question Conversion of matter into energy is a commonplace, as in the burning of coal to heat a building, he said. The reverse process, making of matter from energy, is, however, a question in dispute among scientists.

The most intensive work has been done by U. S. department of agriculture chemists who have worked out a few of the processes by which plants grow but have not yet proved the actual creation of matter.

Dr. Spessard emphasized that he did not want to claim definite proof of such creation, which would substantiate recent theories that the universe is deathless. His results showed definitely, however, that plants receiving no other stimulus except sunlight actually gained weight, he said.

Sealed in Tubes He sealed up about one gram of cyanophyce, which are blue green algae, in airtight glass tubes containing water, in tubes together with a few microscopic animals. As a "control" to check on the plant, he sealed up ordinary water in another series of tubes.

At the end of ten months, during which all of the tubes were kept under a bell jar in a laboratory window, he found that the tubes containing the plants weighed a few tenths of a milligram more than the tubes which did not contain the plants.

This result must have occurred from the action of chlorophyll, the green coloring matter of plants contained in the cells of growing plants called photoplasts, he believes.

Transform Energy "It has long been realized by physicists that somewhere in the universe energy may possibly be transformed into matter," Dr. Spessard declared. "The one place in the universe where the product of energy absorption appears to be almost if not quite unique, is the living protoplasm containing chlorophyll."

Thus, he adds, not only the energy of light rays may be captured by chlorophyll, "but their mass as well."

Recognizing the method as a new approach for plant physiologists to study a possible cycle in nature, Dr. Spessard urged that his results be checked to prove or disprove them.

EUGENE, Jan. 3.—(AP)—Taking the 1935 federal business census started in this county Thursday afternoon with six enumerators working the first day and more to be added from time to time.

Oren C. Davis, supervisor for the western Oregon district, which embraces all counties in the state west of the Cascade mountains, except Multnomah, has opened his office here and started preliminary organization.

Davis stated that every retail and wholesale business, all hotels, places of amusement, business services companies, insurance agencies, real estate offices and trucking and bus companies; all banks, office building managers and contractors, will be canvassed for reports on their operations during the calendar year.

The reports are to be tabulated in Philadelphia headquarters of the business census, and become the basic statistics which businesses use in planning their operating policies.

ASTORIA, Ore., Jan. 3.—(AP)—Turbulent seas, agitated by southwest storms the past two weeks, seriously damaged the sea end of the south jetty of the Columbia river, new under reconstruction by Winston Hoy and the Guy P. Atkinson Co. It was reported here today.

About 200 feet of the big jetty—150 feet wide at the base and some 30 feet high—have been washed out by a series of storms.
