E. C. W. AGENCIES CONFER AND MAP PERMANENCY PLAN

Steps for a permanent organization were taken yesterday at a conference of technical agencies of the emergency conservation work in the courtroom of the federal building. The conference comprised two sessions, one in the morning, the other in the afternoon.

H. C. Oby, assistant supervisor of the Rogue River National forest, was elected chairman and C. I. East, ECW clerk of Crater Lake National park, was chosen secretary. G. F. Whitworth, assistant ECW engineer of Crater Lake National park, and Capt. Ernest W. Kruhn, executive officer of the Medford CCC district, were appointed a committee to prepare a set of by-laws for consideration at the next meeting, scheduled for January 18. It was decided to meet on the third Saturday of each month in Medford.

Purpose of the organization is to work out plans for the future functioning of the emergency conservation work as it concerns the Civilian Conservation Corps and to consider joint recommendations that should be made to Washington, D. C., as a result of experience obtained in the field, it was explained. The organization was proposed by David H. Canfield, superintendent of Crater Lake National park, who opened the session and presided until Mr. Oby was chosen chairman.

Present, in addition to those already named, were Karl L. Janouch, supervisor of Rogue River National forest; V. V. Harpam, supervisor, and Gordon March, in charge of CCC operations, Umpqua National forest, Roseburg; Tom Jones, supervisor, Klamath National forest, Klamath Falls; Glenn C. Mitchell, superintendent, and Don Cameron, superintendent of construction, Siskiyou National forest, Grants Pass. Also Maj. John C. Pales, engineer, federal division of grazing, Reno, Nev.; Fred B. McKinney, representing S. H. Boardman, state representative of Grants Pass; M. W. Averill, national ECW representative for the northwest; Burns; G. C. Fairchild, game management agent of the U. S. biological survey, and Clark W. Fenalar, project superintendent of Clear Lake CCC camp.

A name for the organization is to be adopted at the next meeting.

PAIR PERISH IN CHEHALIS BLAZE

CHEHALIS, Wash., Jan. 4.—(AP)—No inquest will be held by Coroner W. D. Turner into two fatalities resulting from the \$75,000 fire which destroyed the Denhof block early this morning, he announced tonight.

The dead are: Dr. Cecil Candemeyer of Lunden, a veterinarian who had been doing testing work here among cattle. He was identified by County Agent F. D. Yeher.

A man tentatively identified as T. W. Searle of Seattle, a clerk. Mrs. Searle is reported on her way here to view the body.

The two men lost their lives because they took time to dress completely and pack their luggage, Dr. Turner said. If they had left the building when they heard the fire alarm they would have been able to escape without injury, he asserted.

YANKEE HOSPITAL IN ETHIOPIA HIT BY FASCIST BOMB

ADDIS ABABA, Jan. 4.—(AP)—Fascist fliers showered bombs over wide areas of Ethiopia today and an American field hospital was reported to have been among the victims of the aerial assault.

Dr. T. A. Lambie, head of the Red Cross in Ethiopia, said he was informed in a message from Daggah Bur that that southern point, including the field hospital, had been bombed. No details were given. The fact that no casualties were reported led to belief here that occupants of the hospital, including foreign-born, escaped.

An Ethiopian communique also denied a rumor that Harar, Ethiopia's second largest city, was being bombed from the air.
