Stores of Wheat Low This Winter

SEATTLE, Jan. 15.—(AP)—U. S. department of agriculture statisticians today said that, except for a year ago, current farm holdings of stored wheat in Washington and Oregon are the lowest in the ten years such figures have been compiled. The two states' farm storages were estimated at 7,038,000 bushels January 1, as compared with 6,667,000 a year ago and a five-year average of 8,458,000 bushels.

CHICAGO, Jan. 16.—(AP)—A purchaser whose name was closely guarded will buy the famous emerald necklace which was the late Mrs. Edith Rockefeller McCormick's most imperial possession. The sale, at a price of \$480,000, was authorized today by Probate Judge William O'Connell. Henry Mannix, of the New York law firm of White and Case, represented the mysterious buyer, and it was announced only that he or she "is living abroad."
