

### CLIMAX NEAR ON EAST ASIA BORDER

TOKYO, Jan. 24.—(AP)—Numerous new frontier incidents between the Japanese-occupied state of Manchoukuo and Soviet-influenced outer Mongolia drove the east Asia border controversy today toward an apparent climax.

A Domei (Japanese) news agency dispatch from Hsinking, capital of Manchoukuo, said that the recurring clashes brought a vigorous protest from the Manchoukuoan foreign office to outer Mongolia—considered by officials as a virtual "final warning."

The Hsinking protest called for "immediate and complete withdrawal of all outer Mongolian troops from Manchoukuo territory."

If the outer Mongolian government disregards this demand, the note said, "the Manchoukuoan government will not be responsible for the consequences."
