

RECRUITER TELLS OF MEDICAL CARE GIVEN NAVAL MEN

The medical attention given to United States navy recruits is explained in the following statement issued today by Ernest M. West, recruiting officer for this district: "From the first day of his entry into the naval service, the recruit is under constant medical observation, commencing with his preliminary physical examination at the recruit-

ing station for his entry into the service, where his physical fitness is determined and his previous medical history is noted. He is next re-examined upon his arrival at the training station to insure that no disqualifying defects have been overlooked at the recruiting station.

"Only those who can meet a high physical standard are accepted. It then becomes the duty of the medical department to take such measures as are designed to increase his physical fitness and promote general health. Many small defects, not of sufficient consequence to disqualify for enlistment, are remedied. Particular attention is given to the teeth, which are charted, defects noted and repairs made. A prophylactic cleaning is also done.

"For a period of three weeks after arrival the man is retained in a detention unit where he is observed for the appearance of any communi-

cable diseases with which he may have become infected prior to his arrival. During this period he is vaccinated against smallpox and typhoid fever. He is also indoctrinated with the fact that he is to report to the dispensary if he is ill or injured in any way and that it is essential for the prevention of disease to report even the most minor ailments. He is taught personal hygiene and oral prophylaxis by a series of lectures by the medical and dental officers.

"Throughout his entire service, his health is carefully guarded by the medical department. Before engaging in athletics he is examined to determine if sports might be injurious to his health. Before being assigned to any special duties, such as aeronautics, diving, submarine duty, etc., for which special physical qualifications are required, he is carefully examined. In addition to the frequent phy-

sical examinations for the control of communicable diseases, he is examined on every transfer and before being discharged. "A complete record of all these examinations is kept. Skilled doctors, surgeons, dentists, pharmacists, nurses and hospital corpsmen, aboard ship and at hospitals ashore, are constantly on duty, not only to care for but to prevent sickness and epidemics.

"The navy recruiting office in the postoffice building will be glad to answer questions concerning the naval service."

FEDERAL MOTOR ACT WILL BE EXPLAINED HERE FEBRUARY 3-4

Announcement was received today from Herbert H. Hauser, chief field supervisor of the motor transportation department that it is extremely important that all individuals, firms or associations engaged in transportation for hire by motor vehicle of persons or freight, or of both, file application for certificate or permit under the federal motor carrier act. This must be done at the earliest possible date so that such appli-

cations will be on file with the interstate commerce commission in Washington, D. C., not later than February 12, 1936, in order that their rights under that new law may be preserved and protected.

Every assistance in the preparation and filing of applications will be rendered to carriers by T. B. Johnston, representing the interstate commerce commission, who will be at the Jackson hotel here February 3 and 4.

Many carriers who confine their operations to Oregon may be engaged in interstate commerce and thus are subject to the federal law. "Do not overlook this opportunity to consult with Mr. Johnston and learn from him definitely your correct status. It will avoid trouble and delay in the future," warned Mr. Hauser. TURKEY GROWERS DIVIDE \$203,309

ROSEBURG, Ore., Jan. 24.—(AP)—Approximately 700 western Oregon turkey growers, members of the Oregon Turkey Growers, Inc., have received a total of \$203,309.50 for turkeys shipped to Thanksgiving and Christmas markets, according to an announcement today by Mrs. Christina Micelli, secretary-treasurer of the co-operative.

Checks have been mailed growers for all birds shipped during November and December, the November pools bringing a total of \$48,

\$98.35 net to the growers, while checks are now being delivered for the December pool, which netted \$124,911.15. These payments were made after the association had deducted packing, handling and administrative charges.
