PROSPEROUS YEAR AHEAD DECLARES DE SOTO CHIEFTAIN

America can look back at 1935 with pardonable pride and forward into the new year with every reason to expect another good business year.

The year just past—a year of definite, sustained progress—carried the nation a long way back toward sound economic recovery. And, more important, the passing year left the promise of even better times ahead.

In the vanguard of the 1935 recovery parade, the automobile industry more than kept its promise of a year ago to produce and sell 3,500,000 new cars and trucks. Latest available figures indicate the industry turned out more than 4,000,000 units during the year.

Despite this big sales year, the industry still faces the largest replacement market in its history. Surveys show that 7,000,000 cars in operation on American streets and highways are seven years old, or older.

As the average age of a motor car is estimated at eight years, this means that almost one third of all the cars now in operation will reach the old-age limit in 1936.

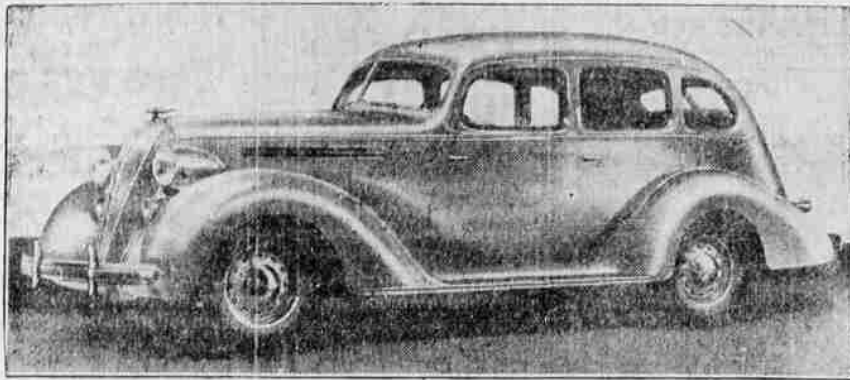
TEACHERS FACE STRICTER TESTS IN PENNSYLVANIA

HARRISBURG, (UP)—Pennsylvania is seriously considering advancing the minimum qualifications for persons following the teaching profession in the commonwealth.

Leading educators of the state are being polled by the state department of public instruction for their views on a proposal to set a four-year teachers' training minimum before they can be granted a teacher's certificate.

The proposal, advanced at a recent convention of the state council of

education, would become operative for teachers entering service after Oct. 1, 1940. However, by Sept. 1, 1937, the minimum would have advanced to three years for all new teachers with regard to post-high school training.

Dr. Henry Konower, chief of the teachers' division of the education department, is in charge of the survey. College presidents, supervising principals and superintendents are being polled on the issue.

The present system provides for the certification of elementary teachers before granted a state standard limited certificate.

This certificate is valid for three years and is renewable for additional periods upon satisfactory rating and completion of 12 semester hours of further approved preparation. A pro-

visional college teaching certificate can be obtained after completion of an approved four-year teacher education course.

SCOURGE OF POLIO TRACED FAR BACK IN NEWEST STUDY

NEW YORK.—(UP)—Infantile paralysis, regarded as just another one of the many troubles that people did not have to worry about till modern times, is actually a scourge as old as the history of man.

The fact is brought out in a sur-

vey recently completed by Dr. LeRoy W. Hubbard, director of extension work for the Warm Springs Foundation of New York, in which he reviewed the disease in its ancient and modern aspects.

"The only new thing about infantile paralysis is its present-day name and the fact that in recent years it has reached pan-epidemic proportions," Dr. Hubbard says. He points out that Dr. Victor Clarence Vaughan, noted medical historian, has reported "definite evidence of infantile paralysis in Egyptian mummies."

Dr. Hubbard's survey, concentrated for the most part on the situation in the United States, emphasized the seriousness of the disease in modern times, offset only by the work of scientific investigators and of lay work-

"The first big modern epidemic in the United States, emphasized the points out, occurred in 1916. It reached every state in the union and struck down more than 25,000 persons, the majority of them children. Since then all states have had recurrent attacks, and large or small outbreaks have prevailed almost annually."

"The investigator believes that 1935 will stand out in the history of the scourge in this country as the first when there were widespread epidemics in southern states. North Carolina had more than 800 cases, Virginia about 600, New York, New Jersey, Connecticut, Kentucky, Michigan and California all suffered from attacks. Total number of 1935 cases will reach more than 10,000, he estimates.
