known loss of two 28 foot cabin cruisers. Ten other pleasure craft were missing.

Two people died in freakish weather accidents in the San Francisco Bay area Tuesday.

They are a simple people who seek an isolation from the outer world, in order to carry out their "back to nature" plan away from the prying eyes of the curiosity seeking public.

The Hesperian colony, the locale for the film "Hesperia," is quite a city in itself. The members have banded together and formed a club with their own private swimming pool, volleyball courts, guest cottages and community dining room. Incidentally, nudists cover their body with clothing while they eat.

Because of the rare, naked truth and boldness of this picture, persons under 18 will not be admitted unless accompanied by their parents.
