The Bristol reported that the Los Angeles police let them into California "in spite of their travel-worn appearance." Feeling seems to be running high against the attitude of the police in southern California, they said.

Sunny California proved to be a moving lake. Cars were re-routed south of Merced and north of there, the highway was a foot under water at a number of points. "Southern Oregon is about the best place in the world and is actually the only place in the United States that hasn't had some form of weather mishap this winter as far as we can find out," the Bristol said.
