OREGON STATE COLLEGE, Feb. 14. 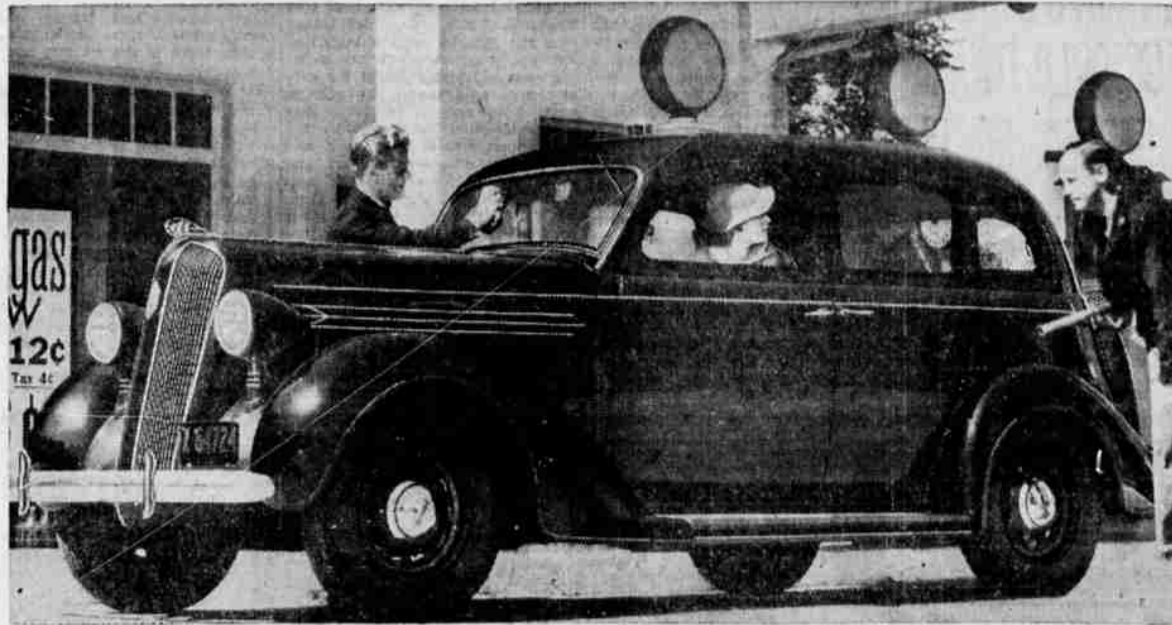

GRAND JURY CALLED TO CONCLUDE CASES BEFORE NEW COURT

The grand jury, George Treichler of Central Point foreman, will be called next Tuesday, February 18, District Attorney George Coddling announced this morning. The grand jury is expected to conclude its inquiry before Monday, February 24, when a new term of the circuit court opens.

The grand jury has before it a number of unfinished investigations, including the baffling death last November of Geo. Hall, Elk creek rancher, and the suicide in the county jail last December of Myles Randall, dependent over approaching return to the state prison as a parole violator.

New cases to be considered include Kenneth DeWitt Powell of Central Point, charged with a statutory offense, with a woman hitchhiker, wife of a navy sailor as the complaining witness. Powell is at liberty on bonds. The complaining witness is at present at Bremerton, Wash., and may be returned as a grand jury witness, the district attorney says.
