UNIQUE LIBRARY TO AID BUILDING BY GOVERNMENT

WASHINGTON—(UP)—A unique "library" of building materials will be in the procurement division gallery of the treasury department now under construction. The "library books" will be samples of materials. The primary purpose of the display, Rear Admiral C. J. Peoples, director of the division, said, is to facilitate work of division architects by making possible the selection of satisfactory materials indigenous to the localities in which federal buildings are being erected. "The essential function of the exhibit," he said, "is similar to that of a reference library. A portfolio for the use of architects and engineers, lists each sample, with notations as to classification, description, location, size limitations and recommendations as to use. The architect selected to design the building can study these samples." Organizations representing producers in each of the 16 major classifications of building materials have been working in co-operation with the division in planning the display. ARCTIC CULTURAL HISTORY TRACED BY YALE GROUP

NEW HAVEN, Conn. (UP)—Many unusual projects are being carried out by investigators attached to the Peabody museum at Yale university. Dr. Cornelius Osgood, curator of anthropology, who has devoted his research to the far north, has completed the third of a series of Alaskan ethnological field studies. Most of the trip was devoted to the Ingalik, an Athapaskan-speaking tribe of Eskimo, where a surprising rich culture has been recorded. According to Osgood, fruition of his work promises to change fundamentally the present conception of these primitive people. In the field of oceanography, the Bingham foundation at the Peabody
