

DYNAMITE USED IN OLYMPIA BLASTS

OLYMPIA, Feb. 21.—(AP)—Dynamite caused the mysterious explosions which yesterday wrecked two dairy plants here. Detective Ray Hays and Max P. Mroha, explosive expert, said today.

Five persons narrowly escaped possible death or serious injury. Frank Andrews, a longshoreman, suffered a severe cut on his hand.

Two blasts demolished the Sanitary dairy in downtown Olympia and badly damaged the Olympia Milk Producers' association, a cooperative, several blocks removed from the business center.

Police Chief John M. Walker said he expected some definite developments today as a result of "several good leads." Owners of the wrecked businesses were at a loss for any explanation of the vandalism.

Onion market was a trifle softer locally with a desire on the part of holders to take profits.

Country-killed meats continued generally firmly priced.

Asparagus was showing reduced prices with increasing movement out of San Francisco and Stockton.

Celery market was mixed with a considerable price range.

Good peas were selling around 7 1/2 lb. with others 5c or less.

A truckload of bulk turnips from the south relieved the local famine with sales up to 50c dozen bunches.

Search for Leftovers.
Leftovers can be developed into tasty meals if a little care is taken.

Dinner Serving Four.
Shepherd's Pie
Caramel Rolls
Pickle Relish
Grapejuice Snow Pudding
Sugar Drops
Coffee
Milk for Children
Shepherd's Pie.

(From Sunday Dinner Leftovers)
1 cup diced cooked meat
1/2 cup cooked peas
1/4 cup diced celery
1 tablespoon chopped onion
1/4 teaspoon pepper
1/4 teaspoon salt
1 cup gravy or milk
1 1/2 cups mashed potatoes
2 tablespoons cream
1 teaspoon chopped parsley.
Mix cream, potatoes and parsley. Spread over rest of ingredients placed in buttered, shallow baking dish. Bake 20 minutes in moderate oven.

Caramel Rolls.
2 cups flour
4 teaspoons baking powder
4 tablespoons lard
1/4 teaspoon salt
2-3 cup milk
1/2 cup brown sugar
2 tablespoons butter
Mix flour, baking powder and salt. Put in lard and slowly add milk. When soft dough forms, pat it out until 1/4 inch thick. Spread with rest of ingredients, roll up and cut off 1/2-inch slices. Bake 10 minutes on greased pan in moderate oven. Serve warm.

Sugar Drops.
(Using 2 Egg Yolks)
1/2 cup fat
1 cup sugar
2 egg yolks
1/4 cup milk
1 teaspoon vanilla
1/4 teaspoon almond extract
1/4 teaspoon salt
1 2-3 cups flour
2 teaspoons baking powder.
Cream fat and sugar. Add yolks and milk. Beat 1 minute. Add rest of ingredients and drop portions of dough from tip of spoon onto greased baking sheet. Bake 12 minutes in moderate oven.

To give a distinct flavor to lamb gravy, add one-third cup of currant or plum jelly and mix until the jelly has melted, then serve.

FEIGNING FAINT FINALLY FOILED

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (UP)—It's a good trick if it works. And it did, many times, until it was overdone.

Here's how, according to hospital internes who finally brought it out in the open:

An elderly woman, poorly clad, 40-years late at night in a drug store, night club or restaurant. She asks the proprietor for money, lamenting that she has not eaten for several days. If he refuses, she walks to the rear of the store and draws out a bottle labeled poison. She drinks it and sinks to the floor.

That brings around the erstwhile hard-hearted proprietor. He works frantically to revive her, and does. She departs with money now that his heart has been softened.

The hitch came about when the woman took too much chloroform from the "poison" bottle, which is intended to gaze the woman but not to make her unconscious. The internes never found it necessary to take her to the hospital. The "suicide" business went into a slump.

EVOLUTION OF CLOCKS SHOWN BY COLLECTION

BOSTON (UP)—James Conlon, a clock maker for 35 years, has a clock collection that depicts their progress through history.

He has Quaker clocks, grandfather clocks, cable and wooden clocks, ones that tick on monotonously and some that have two-octave chimes.

The Quaker timepiece is called the "coffin clock" because of its construction—a long wooden case with only a simple wooden scroll and a chaste metal ornament on the outside.

Conlon's wooden clocks probably were made in Holland or Germany about the 17th century.

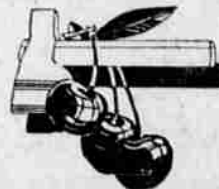
