WASHINGTON, Feb. 22. (AP) - A bi-partisan committee was named today by Speaker Byrns to investigate charges that old age pension organizations - among which was listed the Townsend plan - had collected thousands of dollars in dimes and quarters for "fantastic" schemes.

The investigation, "welcomed" by officials of the Townsend organization, will be directed by Representative Bell (D., Mo.) Bell introduced the resolution for the inquiry and the house adopted it by a 249 to 4 vote.

Other members of the committee are Representatives Lucas (D., Ill.), Gavanon (D., N.Y.), Toland (D., Calif.), Hollister (R., Ohio), Collins (R., Calif.), Ditter (R., Pa.) and Hofmann (R., Mich.)

Bell said the committee would be called together probably Monday for organization and to decide how much money it would need. The resolution does not specifically mention the Townsend plan for payment of \$500 a month pensions to all persons 60 or older but Byrns and other house leaders agreed it was aimed at that organization.

Bell said he did not know the Townsend sentiments of his committee members. He added that he did not care what their sentiments were so long as they were "the honest, fair and just men, which I know Speaker Byrns would appoint."

Representative McGroarty (Dem., Calif.), introducer of Townsend legislation in congress, said he was "satisfied with the committee, although it would be better if Bell were not on it because of his bias."

With ice on the Missouri river 30 inches thick, farmers in the Yankton, S. D., vicinity made preparations for flight from the bottom lands in the case the "break up" should come suddenly.

POCATELLO, Idaho, Feb. 22. (AP) - Waters of Pocatello creek and the Fort Hall overflow canal, three miles north and west of here, leaped their banks today, and rushing westward toward the Fortneer river, caused heavy damage and stalled westbound traffic.

Caused by rapidly melting snows, the water, four feet deep in many places, swept across the old Oregon trail west of here and auto travel was detoured to reach American Falls.

The rising flood also was spreading over the Yellowstone park highway and it was feared that an additional 12 hours of warm weather would multiply damage.

At Tyehe, north of Pocatello, many fields were flooded, and autoists reported considerable damage was caused at American Falls.
