

MEDFORD'S CLAIM FOR AIR DEFENSE PUT TO SENATOR

CAPITULATION OF JAPANESE REBELS CALMS SITUATION

of the bustling, rumor-ridden city. The imperial palace was silent behind military barricades of soldiers and loose rolls of barbed wire.

Only an occasional automobile bearing a statesman or a high army officer, was admitted into the palace grounds.

Previous to their capitulation, the rebels, self-styled "direct action" party members, had withdrawn from some of their formerly held positions before the threat of the loyal troops of Lt. Gen. Koki Kashii, commander of the Tokyo garrison and the man entrusted with the enforcement of martial law in the city of Tokyo.

Punishment Waits
The agreement with the rebels was

understood to be confined to their promise to return to their regimental barracks at Azabu, leaving the question of their punishment for future negotiation.

An authority stated that the rebels had agreed to dissolve their insurrectionary organization and to submit at once to the order of their regimental commanders. They must be back in barracks by 8 a. m. Friday and, in the meantime, are permitted to retain their arms.

Among the first to leave were said to be those who had occupied the residence of the late Premier Okada, whom they assassinated in their sudden uprising Wednesday before dawn.

U. S. Condoles
Ambassador Grew of the United

States visited the foreign office today and conveyed the condolences of the Washington government to Japan over the assassinations of Premier Okada, Finance Minister Korekiyo Takahashi, Admiral Makoto Saito, lord keeper of the privy seal, and Gen. Jotaro Watanabe, director of military education.

Speculation over the identity of the next premier mentioned most frequently Baron Kiichiro Hiratuma, vice-president of the privy council and noted head of fascist organizations, and former War Minister Gen. Sado Araki.

A brief announcement disclosed that the late Premier Okada was buried with simple rites, conducted by two of his secretaries, and with

no distinguished persons present. The place and time of the funeral were not mentioned.

The government also announced this afternoon that Finance Minister Korekiyo Takahashi died after being attacked yesterday, bringing the total number of government leaders dead to four.
