

PT. ORFORD BUOY WANDERS AT SEA

PORTLAND, March 6. — (AP) — E. C. Merrill, district lighthouse superintendent, wouldn't be at all surprised if a new crop of sea serpent stories appears.

Their origin would rest in a wandering buoy.

Several days ago the buoy, normally anchored at Port Orford on the southern Oregon coast, was reported whistling and blinking in true buoy style about 50 miles northwest of its scheduled position. It broke loose from its moorings in a storm.

A lighthouse tender has been prepared to dash after the traveler for several days, but no recent reports as to its whereabouts have been received, Merrill said.

If its whistle and blinker still operate, however, shippers opined it will be heard before long. The lighthouse service said the buoy was valued at more than \$5,000.

STEEL PILOTING PROSPERITY SHIP

TUCSON, Ariz., March 6. — (AP) — Charles G. Dawes, former vice-president of the United States, said today heavy industry, led by steel, has a two-year period of prosperity ahead of it.

"If the same thing happens at the same period in this recovery as in the two great depressions commencing in 1873 and 1893," Dawes said, "the present upward tendency in steel ingot production and heavy industries generally should, during this calendar year, reach a point equalling nearly, if not fully, production capacity."

URGES DENTISTS FIGHT SOCIALIZED MEDICINE

PORTLAND, March 6. — (AP) — Dr. George B. Winter, president of the American Dental Association, vigorously assailed proposals for socialized medicine here today.

He called upon 200 dentists at the annual convention of the Oregon Dental Association to unite against "this danger."

He opposed "any plan of socialized health service that will include the major part of the population, whether it be by taxation or by compulsory payments."

STATE GAINS TITLE TO EUGENE BUILDING

EUGENE, Ore., March 6. — (AP) — The state of Oregon, acting through the state board of higher education, took title to the eight-story Miner building in the heart of Eugene's business district following tax litigation.

The revised trust agreement carries out the original intent of the donor, H. T. Miner and W. E. Miner, deceased, by stipulating that all net income from the building be used to finance a chair of real estate and insurance in the University of Oregon, and to provide research funds.

RECOVER BODY OF BOY DROWNED AT DALLAS

THE DALLAS, Ore., March 6. — (AP) — Searchers this morning found the body of Joe Zerlin, 6, who with his grandfather, Fred Zerlinden, 70, drowned in flood-swollen Mill creek here last night.

The body of the aged man was recovered late last night after several hours of search.

It was believed the two fell while attempting to cross a footbridge over the muddy stream.

Stunting Aviatrix Succumbs In Reno

LOS ANGELES, March 6. — (AP) — A telegram received by Union Air terminal today told of the death of Adoree Neville, woman stunt flyer, in St. Mary's hospital at Reno, Nev., last night.

The message, sent by the hospital, asked the airport's aid in locating the aviatrix's mother, Mrs. Georgian Bond Neville, formerly of Portland, Ore.

Holder of a transport pilot's license, Miss Neville's spectacular career included parachute jumping, and racing in motorboats, automobiles and on motorcycles.

Oregon Pioneer Taken By Death

FOREST GROVE, Ore., March 6. — (AP) — Funeral services for Joseph Lankton Carter, 91-year-old Oregon native, were to be held here today. He died at the Masonic home yesterday.

Carter was born in 1845 at the Methodist mission founded by Jason Lee a few miles south of the present site of Salem. He served as superintendent of schools at La Grange a few years after graduating in 1868 from Oregon Institute, now Willamette university.
