

# JAPANESE ARMY THWARTS EFFORT FORM MINISTRY

(Continued from Page One.)

permitted to join the ministry unless their terms were met.

**Change Army Leadership**  
The militarists raised this unexpected opposition to Hirota just as sweeping changes in the army leadership arose as another sequel to the short-lived insurrection, a new commander in chief being selected for Manchoukuo and three more senior generals being retired.

The army's refusal to supply a general to fill the war ministry in the crisis could defeat the efforts of any premier-designate to create a cabinet.

Tonight, after a day of feverish negotiations, the situation was deadlocked.  
Hirota was conferring with his close associates on how to deal with the army's demands and whether to appoint one or two of the prospective ministers distasteful to the army, thereby achieving a compromise to permit formation of a ministry.

**Yoshida Disliked**  
The nominations which the army opposed most were not disclosed, but militarists were understood to look with disfavour upon Shigeru Yoshida, proposed as minister for foreign affairs.

Admiral Osamo Nagano, selected as navy minister, arrived in Tokyo from the London naval conference and drove to Hirota's residence where he accepted formally the navy portfolio, indicating the navy did not join in the army opposition.

The governor of the Tokyo stock exchange, which has been closed since the militarist insurrection broke out Feb. 26, announced today that the exchange would reopen tomorrow, but with political clouds gathering again, he withdrew the announcement.

The governing body of the exchange decided to meet tomorrow morning to review the situation.

That great tension persisted in government circles, with fears of further violence against distinguished leaders of the empire, was indicated by the scores of gendarmes and police guarding the office residence of the foreign minister.
