ICKES IN ATTACK ON FOES OF PWA

WASHINGTON, March 11.—(AP)—In a new attack on opponents of PWA's \$78,000,000 municipal program, Secretary Ickes said today the central Vermont public service corporation had offered inducements to Brandon, Vermont, to work its PWA power allotment...

LAMSON RELATES OWN ACTIONS ON DAY OF TRAGEDY

SAN JOSE, March 11.—(AP)—David A. Lamson, charged with wife murder, testified Tuesday in his own defense.

His story was virtually identical with his testimony at his previous trial, the first of which brought conviction, later overturned by the state supreme court, and the second a jury disagreement.

The defendants told of playing bridge with Mrs. Allene Lamson the night before her death at the Palo Alto home of Dr. and Mrs. Wesley Wright. He told of their return to their Stanford university campus bungalow, and of Mrs. Lamson's illness with indignation during the night.

He said he arose about 6:00 a. m. and went into the back yard to work, finally raking debris into a small bonfire. It was a bright Memorial day morning (1933), with a slight breeze. About 9:00 a. m. he prepared breakfast for his wife, he said, drew her bath, and awakened her. He went to the bathroom with her and she held his hands to steady herself as she stepped into the tub, he testified.

Some 40 minutes later Mrs. Julia Place, real estate agent, arrived at the house to show it to a client—the Lamsons having planned to sell it for the summer. It was then Lamson said he found his wife's body in the bathtub.

At the conclusion of testimony regarding the scene in the bathroom and the defendant's conduct after the body was found, a court recess was ordered.

DEPUTY SHERIFF KILLED IN STREET

HOQUIAM, March 11.—(AP)—Carl M. Stearns, deputy sheriff and chief criminal investigator for Grays Harbor county, was shot and killed early this morning at Copalis Beach, north of here, while investigating recent robberies at the beach following opening of the clam season last week.

The deputy's body was found lying in the center of the town, with a bullet hole through his head. The body bore marks of a terrific struggle, a deep scalp wound and torn clothing showing Stearns had fought to save his life. The body was found by Jesse King, negro janitor and long time beach resident, who said he stumbled across it in the darkness while going to the beach to dig clams shortly before 8 o'clock.

Shortly Jeff Bartel and other deputies were investigating the murder today. Royal Maurice was booked on an open charge. Bartel revealed nothing of any evidence against him.

MONOPOLIZING MAMAS MAKING NEUROTICS OF CHILDREN OF NATION

ST. LOUIS, Mo., March 11.—(AP)—A noted psychiatrist today blamed "monopolizing mamas" for the nation's crop of young neurotics and delinquents.

Dr. Alfred Adler, Viennese physician and psychologist, said many modern mothers were assuming too much control over the interests of their children with the result their offspring were independent, introverted and selfish.

"They are more interested in themselves than others," he asserted. "They suffer from mental confusion, phobias, foolish ideas. They have an in-
