Mae West, Victor McLaglen Coming Thursday



Victor McLaglen, winner of the Academy Award for 1915 with his work in "The Informer," is cast as Mae West's chief menace in "Klondike Annie," soon to be shown at the Craterian theater.

With advance reports bringing glowing notices of this new MacDonald-Eddy musical, "Rose Marie" is expected to set new box office records in Medford, as it has been doing elsewhere.

Following "Rose Marie," Franchot Tone will be shown in Martin Moonsey's sensational expose of the racket that almost cost him his life, and when printed in his newspaper, cost him a fine and jail sentence for not revealing to the court where he obtained his information. It is "Exclusive Story" and has Madge Evans heading the supporting cast.

On the 19th will be shown the special road show attraction, with all seats reserved, Max Reinhardt's production of Shakespeare's "Midsummer Night's Dream," boasting a cast of one thousand "name" players.

Then will be Victor McLaglen, who won the Academy Award for the year past, with Freddy Bartholomew in "Professional Soldier."

On Sunday, March 22, Mae West's newest release, "Klondike Annie," will open its local run, followed by Lionel Barrymore in "The Voice of Bugle Ann," Wallace Berry, Barrymore and Aline MacMahon in "Ah Wilderness," open on the 26th, bringing to the screen the down-to-earth human story of America in which Will Rogers appeared on the stage last year on the coast.

The new Astaire-Rogers dancing treat, "Follow the Fleet," will be here on the 29th, and is followed, in order, with "Paddy O'Day," featuring Jane Withers and Pinky Tomlin, and next Jean Harlow in "Buff Ruff," in which

the screen's most famous platinum blonde introduces her new "honey-brown" hair style.

Others to follow the above named films include "Give Us This Night," starring Gladys Swarthout and Jan Kiepura; "Seven Keys to Baldpate," with Gene Raymond featured, and the biggest hit of several years, "The Country Doctor," with the world-famous Dianna Quintuples appearing for the first time in a full length feature with Jean Herzhold, Slim Sumnerville, Dorothy Peterson and other screen favorites. "Petrified Forest," co-starring the team of "Of Human Bondage," Betty Davis and Leslie Howard, is slated for an early showing with Harold Lloyd in "The Milky Way," Clark Gable, Jean Harlow and Myrna Loy in "Wife versus Secretary," and the first all-in-color outdoor film "Trail of the Lonesome Pine," soon to follow.

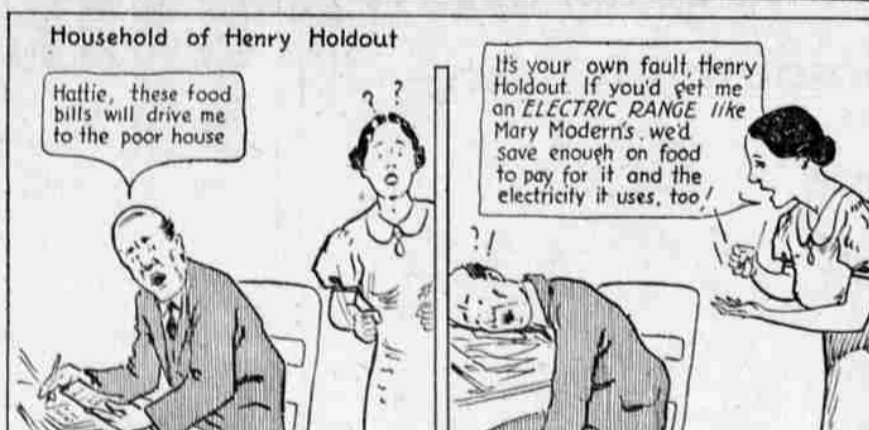
"Melody Trail" not only is distinguished in its musical background by Autry's singing, but has a rather unique plot for pictures of this type.
