

NO FORMALITY IN COOKING CLASSES OF GAS COMPANY

More than 100 women were present today and yesterday afternoon and a larger number is expected to attend Saturday's session.

The stage is equipped as a model kitchen featuring Wedgwood ranges and an Electrolux refrigerator to take the drudgery out of cooking. Spring vegetables, meat and pastries were prepared today by the capable young Mrs. Chaney. Various phases of the Wedgwood ranges were explained to the visiting ladies by Foster Cone, Southern Oregon Gas corporation official.

Members of the 4-H clubs of Jackson county will attend a special demonstration Saturday morning at nine o'clock, and anyone interested is also invited to this meeting, according to Mrs. Chaney. The afternoon cooking demonstration will continue from two to five o'clock. Next week a similar program will be carried on in Ashland and Grants Pass, and indications are that a follow-up demonstration will be held in Medford in the near future due to local housewives' great interest in the "Gas Cooking Days," Mr. Cone stated.

SCHENCK CASE TO JURY BY MONDAY

Hearing of testimony continued today in the \$10,000 damage suit of A. Orin Schenck, an administrator for the estate of his father, against Dr. E. W. Sleeter and other defendants. The case is expected to go to the jury next Monday.

The suit is based on an auto accident in September 1935, on West Main street at Mistletoe street, wherein it is alleged that Daniel R. Schenck, father of the plaintiff, was struck by an auto belonging to Dr. Sleeter, and driven by Richard Reum, not by Richard Sleeter, as stated yesterday. It is alleged that the injuries received by the elder Schenck shortened his days.

The accident occurred as the elder Schenck was crossing the street, the complaint cites. Occupants of the auto, besides Richard Reum, the driver, were William Cummings, Robert Sherwood and Richard Sleeter. Reckless and negligent driving is alleged. The youths in the auto are listed as defense witnesses.
