

### TOWNSEND PARTY URGED ON CHIEFS BY MEMBER HERE

James Baker, member of Medford Townsend club No. 2, today placed himself on record as favoring a third party for Townsend candidates. He announced sending the following letter to Dr. Francis E. Townsend and R. E. Clements at Washington headquarters:

"Enclosed you will find a slip of the opponents of the Townsend plan. Now you are reaching a critical time when the Townsend plan is going to be overthrown before it even reaches election this fall. Now the Townsend plan is standing on a very poor foundation by trying to get us to vote either Republican or Democrat, for those that favor the Townsend plan. Now we have no faith in the Democrats or Republicans. They have betrayed the people for more than 20 years and, after they are elected, they will do just as they used to do, but now that you have 90 percent of the people in your favor why don't you put up a Townsend president and a Townsend senator for each state and they will be elected 90 percent majority."

"I consulted my people, which I have the time to do, and from what they tell me if you don't do that your platform will be snuffed in because we are not going to vote for Democrats or Republicans because in the near future we will be worse than China."

### BLOCKADE TARGET FOR SECOND SUIT

LOS ANGELES, March 24.—(AP)—A new suit for injunction to halt the Los Angeles police department's blockade of the state border against transient unemployed was filed in federal court today.

Judge Albert Lee Stephens ordered Police Chief James E. Davis to appear next Monday and show cause why the injunction should not be granted.

John C. Packard, attorney for the American Civil Liberties Union, filed the petition on behalf of John Langgan, Hollywood mining man. Langgan was the plaintiff in a similar suit which Judge Stephens recently dismissed, holding he lacked jurisdiction in the case as then presented.

### STEIWER LASHES ADMINISTRATION

RALEIGH, N. C., March 24.—(AP)—Senator Frederick Steiwer (R-Ore.) asserted the real issue of the 1936 political campaign was "to save America from the New Deal" as he lashed out at the democratic national administration today in the keynote address of the North Carolina republican convention here.

He sharply criticized what he termed the "failure" of the democrats to provide "an adequate, permanent, constitutional farm program," and said "in spite of extravagant spending we have lost ground" in the problem of unemployment.

Steiwer denied republican responsibility for the depression and asserted his party's administration was rendered "utterly impotent" in 1930 by a "coalition in the senate and a heavy democratic majority in the house."

### POSTPONE ACTION ON TURK BROKERS

SACRAMENTO, March 24.—(AP)—Governor Merriam held hearings today on requisitions from Oregon and postponed definite action on both until he has reviewed additional affidavits.

Attorneys for A. Michell and C. J. Molinari, who were arrested in San Francisco on an indictment returned in Jackson county, Oregon, told the governor he lacked jurisdiction because Molinari never had been in Oregon.

Molinari and Michell are charged with having obtained turkeys on commission from Oregon growers and failing to pay for them.

District Attorney G. A. Codding of Jackson county and attorneys for Molinari and Michell were given a week in which to file affidavits.

### SAM BROWN FILES SENATE CANDIDACY

SALEM, March 24.—(P)—Sam H. Brown, Gervais farmer, appeared at the secretary of state's office today and officially filed his name as candidate for the republican nomination for United States senator from Oregon.

Brown, former state senator and candidate for the republican nomination for governor at the last election, will oppose Senator Charles L. McNary for the nomination.

Brown's slogan, referring back to his candidacy for the governorship, was "same old Ford, but a different 640."

Two years ago he conducted his campaign about the state with "640 and a Ford."

### JURY PICKED FOR TRIAL OF BLONDE

NEW YORK, March 24.—(AP)—A jury to try blonde Vera Strutz for the slaying of her lover was completed today.

Miss Strutz, accused of shooting Dr. Fritz Gebhardt, wealthy German industrialist, wept a little during the examination.

Judge Cornelius Collins ordered attorneys to proceed with the selection of two alternates.

He excused one salesman who said he could not serve because "it would shock my family if I were required to deliver a death verdict."

Miss Strutz became hysterical at yesterday's session, during which Samuel Liebowitz, her attorney, questioning a salesman, imputed unnatural love practices to the slain man whose wife and children were left behind in Germany.

She broke into convulsive weeping when her attorney referred to "a woman's right to kill to protect her body."

### TURKS TO ABROGATE LAUSANNE AGREEMENT

BRINDISI, Italy, March 24.—(P)—Radio dispatches received here from Istanbul tonight said the Turkish government has decided to remilitarize the Dardanelles zone, abrogating military clauses of the Lausanne treaty.

### CONVICTS FAIL IN ESCAPE ATTEMPT

SALEM, Ore., March 24.—(AP)—Two convicts' attempt to escape from the state penitentiary today was frustrated by prison guards before the movement had progressed very far.

Warden James Lewis reported. William P. Smith and Harold E. Fleming, serving 10-year sentences for assault with attempt to rob, managed to get out of their cells early today in the old cell block and with a "spreader" in their hands attempted to pry the window bars in the corridor. Their slight freedom was short-lived when the guards discovered the pair.

The two were received at the penitentiary December 6, 1933, following conviction of attempting to rob a drug store in Salem.
