LATEST MODELS TO BE DISPLAYED ON S. P. PARKWAY

Opportunity Given Public to Inspect New Cars—Community Sales Event Will Be Outstanding for Year

As part of Medford's community dollar day celebration, motorcar distributors will hold a display of the latest 1936 fleet, luxurious, streamlined automobiles tomorrow and Saturday at the Southern Pacific lot behind the Western Union office on West Main street.

New International Trucks Have Two Speed Rear Axles

With the International two-speed rear axle in the models CS-30, CS-35, CS-40 and CS-45, the truck owner has both speed and power, combined and available, in one unit, according to Walter W. Abbey, local International dealer.

Mr. Abbey says: "In the past it has been necessary for truck owners requiring variable performance ability to choose between a high or low-speed axle ratio.

The low-gear axle ratio enables heavy loads to be hauled up steep hills and over rough roads, while the high-gear axle ratio allows high speeds on level roads or with light loads. A simple movement of the shifting lever by the driver changes to either low speed or high speed operation instantly and silently without stopping the truck.

A score of witnesses have marched to the stand, with indications as many more would be called.

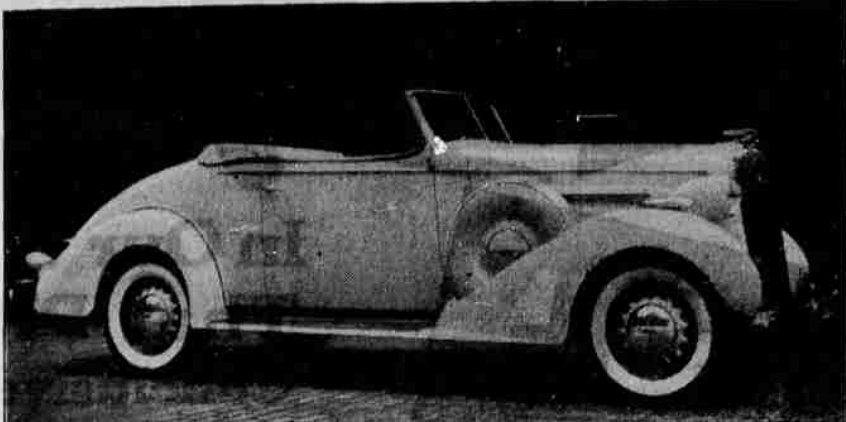
Hamilton is charged with theft of a steer, which he allegedly sold to a cattle buyer, who afterward sold it to a local butcher shop.

MRS. MARTIN ONLY DEMO CANDIDATE FOR COUNTY CLERK

Mrs. Henrietta B. Martin of the Central Point district, president of the "Good Government Congress, Inc.," yesterday afternoon formally filed her candidacy for county clerk on the democratic ticket, for the May 15 primary.

Mrs. Martin in her declaration slogan promises, "economy, efficiency, courtesy, a square deal to all, and favoritism for none."

She is the only democrat to so far file for the clerkship. The filing time expires next Monday.

George R. Carter, incumbent has filed on the republican ticket.

Mrs. Martin three years ago gained considerable publicity for her role in the Banks-Pebl agitation, and was president of the "Good Government Congress," around which Banks and Pebl, now both in state prison, built their turmoil.

District Attorney George A. Coding yesterday filed his petition for nomination, with the secretary of state. He is the only democratic aspirant. Three have filed for the republican nomination—Victor A. Tengwald, Kramer Duvel and Frank J. Newman have filed for the republican nomination.

MITE BABE DIES DESPITE SCIENCE

OAKLAND, Calif., March 26.—(AP)—Science has lost its fight for the life of Nancy Lee Vogt, whose weight at birth, estimated at 15 ounces, classed her as one of the world's tiniest tots.

Born prematurely and nurtured with utmost care in a hospital incubator, the baby appeared past the crisis of immaturity and well on the way to normal infancy when a change was noticed in her condition yesterday, grew rapidly pronounced and resulted in her death two hours later.

Dr. John W. Sherrick, who constantly tended the mite, said her death was due to immaturity and improper development and functioning of some of the vital organs. He added that anemia contributed.

Nancy Lee was born February 2 to Mrs. Anne Vogt, nurse at the hospital where the baby spent its 50 days of existence in an incubator. The father, Paul Vogt, was in a Bakersfield, Calif., sanatorium at the time of his daughter's birth.
