

# LASKA CONVICTION IN KIDNAPING PLOT UPHELD BY COURT

DENVER, Colo., March 27.—(AP)—The conviction of Ben Laska, Denver attorney, for conspiracy in the kidnaping of Charles F. Urschel, Oklahoma oil millionaire, was upheld today by the federal circuit court of appeals.

Laska, nervous and well groomed, was attorney for Albert L. Bates, who with George (Machine Gun) Kelly and others kidnaped Urschel and held him for ransom.

The Denver attorney was accused of accepting part of the Urschel ransom from Bates. Laska contended it was a legal fee.

It was the first case of its kind in federal court in which the government attempted to prosecute an attorney who represented a convicted kidnaper or gangster.

Laska was sentenced to serve ten years in federal prison. Laska's only chance of avoiding his federal prison sentence now lies in an appeal to the United States supreme court.

The arrest of Laska on a charge of complicity in the \$200,000 Urschel kidnaping created a sensation in Denver.

Four other persons were indicted in the case, Mrs. Clara Feldman, wife of Bates; her son, Edward, and her brother-in-law, Alvin Scott, and James C. Mathers, Oklahoma City attorney. The first three pleaded guilty and were freed on probation after they testified for the prosecution.

## State Endeavor Drafting Plans For Eugene Meet

Christian Endeavors all over the state are eagerly looking forward to their 46th annual convention meeting this year in Eugene, April 23-26. The convention theme is "We Choose Christ."

Outstanding features will include a Missionary assembly addressed by 20 representatives of foreign fields, 12 training conferences, denominational luncheons, a large parade Saturday, three banquets, and special music including a concert by the Eugene Gleemen.

It is expected that this will be the largest convention the Oregon Christian Endeavor union has ever held. The convention opens Thursday evening and concludes Sunday evening. All young people are invited to attend. All main sessions will be in the First Christian church, Eugene. The Rev. Milton S. ## MAHONEY FILES AS SENATE CANDIDATE

SALEM, March 27.—(AP)—Willis Mahoney, Klamath Falls mayor, late yesterday filed with the secretary of state as a candidate for the Democratic nomination for United States senator.

"I shall fight for Roosevelt and his policies and against entrenched privilege and the American Liberty League, Hearst, Hoover and Mellon," Mahoney's platform slogan read.

The Klamath Falls man will oppose Judge Jeffrey of Portland, who received the Townsend club endorsement, for the Democratic nomination.

Mahoney, in 1934, was an unsuccessful candidate for the Democratic nomination for governor.

## Portland Leads Safety Contest

PORTLAND, March 27.—(AP)—Portland led today in its "End Sudden Death" contest with Seattle.

Only one traffic accident fatality occurred here since the start of the six-month contest March 1, while four deaths occurred in the northern city.

However, Portland showed 165 injured in the 788 traffic accidents, compared with 129 Seattle injuries in 811 accidents.

The contest is to see which town can show the greater reduction in traffic deaths, injuries and accidents.

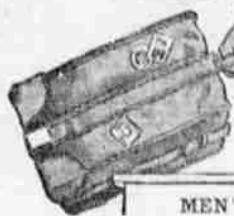
