NEW FOOD TASTES ARE PUBLIC NEED, SOVIET DISCOVERS

MOSCOW (UP)—The Soviet government, having solved its food problem...

The underlying facts in the situation were presented in a statement to the central executive committee by the commissar.

"The food industry needs advertising," Mikoyan declared, "honest Soviet advertising, which will inform consumers about good articles, spreading the knowledge about them and developing the taste for them."

"It is essential to develop Soviet advertising so that the people may know about new kinds of food and order them, so that the tastes of the people be developed for new forms of products and goods."

"We may declare that when the Red army will require food products in the event of war, it is going to get from us an abundance of condensed milk, coffee and cocoa, meat and chicken preserves, tongue preserves, confectioneries, fruit jellies and many other articles which our country richly possesses."

In emphasizing the need for advertising of food products, Mikoyan said that in some parts of the country the use of cheese was not familiar, and in another a peasant ate the skin of an orange with the fruit.

The adequate supply of food products now available results from the success of collectivization, the speaker said, enabling a vast increase in production and the organization of canning, preserving and processing facilities.
