SUPPLY OF WATER FOR LAND NORMAL, ARNSPIGER STATES

The water supply for irrigation will be normal this year, Olen Arnspiger, manager of the Medford and Talent irrigation districts, told the weekly luncheon-meeting of the Kiwanis club at the Hotel Medford yesterday.

If there is a hot summer like that two years ago, however, the storage supply will be exhausted and there will be no carry-over for next year, Mr. Arnspiger added.

The speaker briefly sketched the history of irrigation in the Rogue valley, citing the early fruitless efforts made to insure a steady and adequate supply of water for farm and orchard and pointing to the ultimate success attained in bringing irrigation to valley lands.

Mr. Arnspiger told of the financing of the irrigation projects, the difficulties encountered when the depression came and the accomplishment of the recent re-financing with government aid.

After his talk Mr. Arnspiger, himself a member of the Kiwanis club, was applauded by William Warner as "southern Oregon's first citizen."
