WISCONSIN VOTE FOR ROOSEVELT ECLIPSES BORAH

afforded some clue as to the course taken in the elections by the LaFollette progressives, who had no ticket of their own.

The results indicated the progressives unhampered by any state election law which would prevent their doing so, split up their support, giving most of it to Roosevelt, giving some to Borah.

Progressive leaders had no comment today.

Borah Satisfied
Senator Borah in a statement at Chicago regarded the Wisconsin result as highly satisfactory and said, "If we can have an untrammelled expression of the people of Illinois we will do the same thing here April 14."

In a close fought contest, Mayor Daniel W. Hoan, Milwaukee's socialist executive, was returned to office, defeating Sheriff Joseph H. Shinners, nonpartisan.

The progressives had no advice from their leadership. Gov. Phillip F. La Follette, remained silent in his few pre-campaign statements except to say he would support Roosevelt unless the republicans nominated a better man or no satisfactory third party candidate appeared.

The Socialists' proposal for city purchase of the Milwaukee Electric company's power distribution system apparently was defeated. Returns from 311 precincts showed 81,986 votes were cast in opposition as against 61,029 for it.

Progressives were able to throw their support where they wished, because of Wisconsin's election laws which provide that voters may select any party ballot they wish with no prior registration in that party necessary.

The district attorney's office announced today that protests had been filed with Governor Martin and the state parole board against release of FehI next week. SALEM, April 8. — (AP) — Governor Martin said he would investigate Earl H. FehI's prison conduct later today to determine whether he would be entitled to the minimum term of his four-year sentence, terminating April 15 after 32 months, or if he has violated rules necessitating serving the entire sentence.

The investigation will be made upon receipt of a protest from the Jackson county district attorney, requesting that if FehI, former county judge convicted of participation in the 1933 ballot-box theft, is paroled it be conditioned upon his not returning to Jackson county. The letter also requested FehI serve the maximum sentence.

The governor stated no parole was involved and whether he is released next week depends upon his behavior in the penitentiary. If it is shown he has not violated any rules, his minimum term will stand, and no restrictions can be placed upon him.

The governor was to investigate reports FehI had written letters while in the penitentiary, claimed to be of such nature as to prove an infraction of the rules. The attorney-general's office likewise had received protests against the release of FehI, Deputy Ralph Moody said.

Up to his entanglement in the Banks-Fehl inspired turmoil, Jones was not involved in any legal difficulties and bore a good reputation in the Rogue River district, and in Del Norte county, Calif., where he is well-known.

Earl H. Fehl, co-agitator with Banks in the Jackson county turmoil completes his four-year prison sentence, with "good-time allowances" next April 15. Fehl was sentenced to four years on conviction of ballot theft conspiracy by a Klamath county jury.

The district attorney's office announced today that protests had been filed with Governor Martin and the state parole board against release of Fehl next week. It is urged if release is granted, it be upon condition that he not be allowed to return to Jackson county until expiration of the four-year sentence. No action has yet been taken upon the protest.

Means Security
"That is, security for our colonies. That security will be fully achieved with total annihilation of the Ethiopian military formation, annihilation which cannot be lacking or delayed."

Mussolini asserted the populations of the Ethiopian territory already conquered had demonstrated their "sympathy" for the Italians, and said the work of conquest was going forward without encountering important obstacles.

The matter of testing the constitutionality of the Oregon habitual criminal act, by an appeal to the state supreme court, was still under consideration. Attorney Roberts held that its constitutionality was questioned upon the provisions that an habitual criminal charge could be filed on a district attorney's information, when the state law provides all charges in the circuit court shall be preferred by grand jury indictment.
