BONTEVILLE, Ore., April 10.—(AP)—Taut three-inch cables hummed and steam winches puffed as crib 28, the next to the last section in the main channel cofferdam of the Bonteville power and navigation project, edged into position in the face of a 15-mile an hour current.

Workers at once began piling huge boulders on the barge to sink it into position, and prepared to place the last crib in place late this week.

Hauptmann, they said, left clothing, correspondence and some money, the proceeds of his dollar checks sent him by seekers of his autograph.

Lowland Families Ousted By Floods

GAINEVILLE, Ga., April 10.—(AP)—Flooded southern rivers forced hundreds of lowland families from their homes today, diverting immediate attention from storm-stricken Gainsville and Tupelo, Miss., where commerce was renewed on a limited scale.

Most of the homeless were from the valleys of the Ohio, Mississippi and Tennessee rivers in Tennessee and Kentucky.

The creeping yellow flow of the Tennessee forced out 75 families at Chattanooga.
