

PUNISHED DENTIST SEEKS SOLON SEAT TO CHANGE AD LAW

Suspension by State Board for Advertising 'Satisfaction Guaranteed' Slogan Arouses Portland Man

PORTLAND, Ore., April 10.—(AP) Dr. J. J. Pittenger, aroused over the suspension of his dental license, because a candidate for the state legislature to seek dental law "reform."

His suspension by the state board of dental examiners was for advertising "satisfaction guaranteed."

Recently enacted state laws which prohibit dentists from advertising guaranteed service, prices, superior workmanship or painless dentistry are "too drastic," Dr. Pittenger said.

Another point that chafes is lack of the right to appeal from board decisions.

Board Judge and Jury "The dental board is practically a prosecutor, judge and jury combined," he said.

Dr. Pittenger said he will have plenty to say if he is elected. His 60-day suspension, he said, was equivalent to a fine of \$1000.

"A dentist in his practice can guarantee dentistry in any manner he chooses, but is prohibited from advertising the fact," Dr. Pittenger continued.

Secretary Defends "Rallying to the defense of the law, Dr. Arthur F. Weeks of Portland, secretary of the board of examiners, said advertising is permitted, but 'objectionable' types are forbidden."

"There was a great deal of misleading advertising prior to the enactment of this law," he said.

"Some long-time advertisers have told me they approve the law as it stands and would hate to see the regulations removed. These include dentists who bitterly opposed enactment and early enforcement of the law."

"The measure was designed to take the 'bait' out of dental advertising."

GUITTARD Milk Chocolate RECIPES

Recipe for Rocky Roads

Cut the chocolate into small pieces and place in double boiler for melting. Be careful that the water in the double boiler does not come to a boil as overheating will thicken the chocolate; stir while melting. When chocolate is melted, put cold water in the double boiler and cool the chocolate down until it feels cool when touched to the lip. (This should be about 45-55 degrees F.)

Pour a layer of the melted milk chocolate on the bottom of a metal cake pan and immediately sprinkle small marshmallows and walnuts over the poured chocolate. Then pour more chocolate on top of the marshmallows and nuts and place the pan in a cool well ventilated place, (about 55 degrees to 60 F.) so that the chocolate will harden. When hard take from pan and cut into squares.

For Cake Topping

Melt down the chocolate in a double boiler, same as for making Rocky Roads, and add salad oil after the chocolate has been melted in the proportion of two tablespoons to a pound of chocolate. Mix the oil in well and then change the water from hot to cold in the double boiler, which helps to cool the chocolate faster. When it has reached a temperature of 85 degrees F. (the chocolate will feel cool to the lips) it is ready to apply to the cake. The salad oil keeps the chocolate from becoming hard and gives it a fudge consistency.

For Eating

BOXCAR HOMES BUILT TO EASE RENT PROBLEM

TOPEKA, Kas.—(UP)—The newest community addition to this city will be Westburg, a unit of 38 boxcar homes on the outskirts of Topeka, now under construction.

The idea to provide low-priced living quarters for poor families was conceived by Mrs. W. R. Fish, whose husband died several years ago leaving her with a large tract of land west of the city limits.

Mrs. Fish first attempted to build a bungalow court consisting of 63 small, single-floor five-room dwellings. She was opposed by the city commission and planning board. She finally obtained permission from the fire department to move 38 boxcars to the tract.

Each boxcar will be converted into living quarters to rent for \$10 a month. The car will be partitioned into living room, kitchen and hallway. Regular bunks will be used as beds.

Each occupant will have a small plot of ground for a garden. He will be allowed to paint his boxcar home any color desired and accompanying decorations designed to improve attractiveness.

Mrs. Fish has been a constant critic of high rents in Topeka, particularly for poor families, and often has pointed out that too much relief money goes into the pockets of realtors as high rent instead of being used for food and clothing.
