Hoylman was regarded by the authorities as "not a vicious criminal, but one who would run."

Jailer Ingling thinks that Hoylman planned the dash for liberty since the first of the week when a circuit court jury returned a verdict declaring him an "habitual criminal." He waited his chance and it came Friday night about 9:30 o'clock.

The alarm was spread at once, and within ten minutes the sheriff and state police were in pursuit of the escape.

Eleven other prisoners in the county jail gave no aid to either combatant.

Last winter, when trapped in a local rooming house by the state and city police, Hoylman escaped in his underwear by a quick dash through the door. He was arrested several weeks later at Kerby by CCC enrouteless while trying to steal gas. Hoylman in this escapade stole an auto belonging to Joe Naimes of this city.

Hoylman has been convicted of felonies in this state seven times, and according to police records began his criminal career in this county in 1927 when he was sentenced to two years for forgery committed in Ashland. He was later convicted of forgery in Klamath county, burglary in Coos county and forgery in Marion county. He is resourceful and daring.

The prospects of life imprisonment, with no hope of parole, dimmed his spirits.

## SON OF HOOVER'S ADMITS AAA PAY

BAKERSFIELD, Cal., April 11.—(UP)—Alan Hoover, son of former President Herbert Hoover, received \$4,800 in AAA benefit payments, he admitted here today after news of the fact was reported in Washington.

Young Hoover's father has been a caustic critic of all phases of the new deal which engineered the AAA legislation.

"I hold a minority interest in the Greenfield ranch, just south of Bakersfield," young Hoover said. "I received \$4,800 benefit payment under the AAA agreement."

"In the first place, I was complying with the law, and tickets for the sale of our products could not be issued unless the ranch owners sign the agreement."

"Although the owners did receive this AAA payment," he continued, "they sustained a loss of \$25,000 as a result of unconstitutional acts under the AAA affecting their crops."

He said that his share of another AAA payment was "two dollars, fifty cents and some mills."
