Early sales steers around steady, some bids 10 to 15 lower; heifers about steady, cows steady to 25 higher; bulls and vealers steady; early top 850-lb. fed steers \$8.18. Others \$8.30 down with bulk-fed steers \$7.50 down to \$7, common steers down toward \$5.50. Heifers largely \$6.00-7; few to \$7.25, common kinds down to \$5.25. Low cutter and cutter cows \$2.75-4.50, common to medium grades \$4.75-8.50. Good beef cows \$5.75-6.00; few to \$6.35. Bulls \$5.00-50; vealers \$10.00 down.

SHEEP: Receipts 2,500, 902 direct. Old crop lambs steady; no spring lambs sold, asking around steady, fat wool ewes 25 or more lower; load fed 78-lb. woolled lambs \$10.25, common to medium grades \$8-9.50; shorn lambs \$8-8.25, good to choice springers held above \$10.50; fed feeders to choice woolled lambs \$5.25-50; shorn ewes \$4.25-50.
