

# Medford Masons Host Saturday in Annual Southern Oregon Meet

## EVENING BANQUET TO BE HIGHLIGHT IN DAY'S PROGRAM

State Grand Master Principal Speaker at Lodge Meeting in Evening—Plan Sunday Trips for Many

Tomorrow will see the biggest Masonic meeting in the history of Medford when members of the official family from all of Oregon, and representatives from Grants Pass, Kerby, Ashland, Central Point, Jacksonville, Klamath Falls, Bend, Marshfield, Roseburg, Yreka, Weed and Crescent City come here for the annual southern Oregon regional meeting.

H. Wayne Stanard of McMinnville, grand master of the grand lodge of Oregon, will be the principal speaker of the day at the lodge meeting at 8:30, following the big banquet at 6:30. Other officials and dignitaries of Masonry who will be present will include R. Frank Peters of Hillsboro, deputy grand master; P. C. Howell of Portland, junior grand warden; D. Rufus Cheney of Portland, grand secretary; L. S. Finseth of Dallas, senior grand deacon; Lee Hendricks of Klamath Falls, junior grand steward, and Arthur Molesworth of Portland, grand tyler, as well as several district deputy grand masters.

The day's work will start at 2 o'clock Saturday afternoon, with a full program continuing until 11 o'clock in the evening. With over 400 Masons to be present, the day is to be a gala one in the history of local Masonry, and every effort has been made for the occasion to be a successful one.

Many of the dignitaries of the lodge are expected to remain over in the city for Sunday when excursions are planned to acquaint the visiting members with the beauties of southern Oregon. Several trips are planned to Crater Lake.

## ARIZONA DEBATERS COAST CHAMPIONS

LOS ANGELES, April 17.—(P)—Two debaters from the University of Arizona carried home today the championship of the Pacific Coast Forensic league.

The students, Parrell Mahoney and Roy Morrison, spoke on the question: "Resolved: That the several states should enact legislation providing for a system of complete medical service, available to all citizens at public expense."

University of Southern California, which placed second, captured first honors in the extemporaneous speaking contest with an eloquent representative, Arthur Groman. John Keeter, Willamette university, was second, and Douglas Mahoney, Arizona, third.

Five other universities participated—Stanford, Washington State, Idaho, Nevada, and California at Los Angeles.

## Gold Nuggets

The feat of the golden egg is credited to a goose—a nursery tale. For a true-story fact, look to the little barnyard hen, who every day does a golden deed.

On our daily menu there's nothing more gold in value than the fragile little sphere that the domestic hen gives us. So here's an orchid to our good friend the egg, not only for its marvelous nutritive worth, but for

the endless range of dishes it puts on parade when our imagination takes it by the hand and runs along in step with its versatile inventive bent.

In Lent when meats and sweets are at a minimum, eggs are headliners. Thus—our contribution:

- Sardine Rabbit
- 1 1/2 cups milk.
- 2 tablespoons butter.
- 4-5 Sunshine Krispy Crackers, finely crushed.
- 1/2 teaspoon salt; pepper to taste.
- 6 cardines, skinned and boned.
- 2 teaspoons prepared mustard.
- 1/2 teaspoon paprika.
- 1/2 cup cheese, cut in small pieces.
- Mix first 5 ingredients thoroughly in top of double boiler. Cook and stir well until mixture thickens. Add cheese to sauce and stir until it is melted. Add sardines, the mustard and paprika. Allow to heat well and serve hot on buttered Dutch Rusks or toasted Krispy Crackers.

Eggs Daffodil

- 2 1/2 cups milk.
- 4 tablespoons butter.
- 12 Sunshine Krispy Crackers, finely crumbed.
- 1/2 teaspoon salt; Pepper to taste.
- 5 hard-cooked eggs.
- 6-8 Sunshine Dutch Rusk.
- Mix all ingredients except eggs and Dutch Rusk in upper part of double boiler. Place over boiling water and stir occasionally until thickened. Cut eggs in half and remove yolk. Chop whites, add sauce, and reheat. Pour on Sunshine Dutch Rusk which has been thoroughly heated and spread with butter. Sprinkle on creamed mixture the yolks which have been rubbed through a sieve or ricer. Serves six to eight.
- If a more pungent sauce is wanted, add one teaspoon anchovy paste. All measurements standard.
