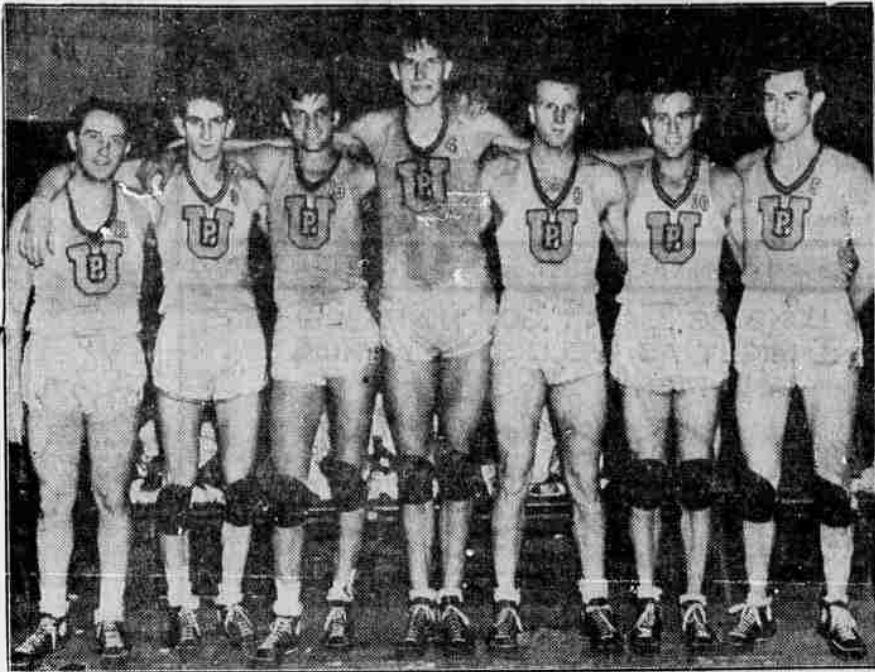
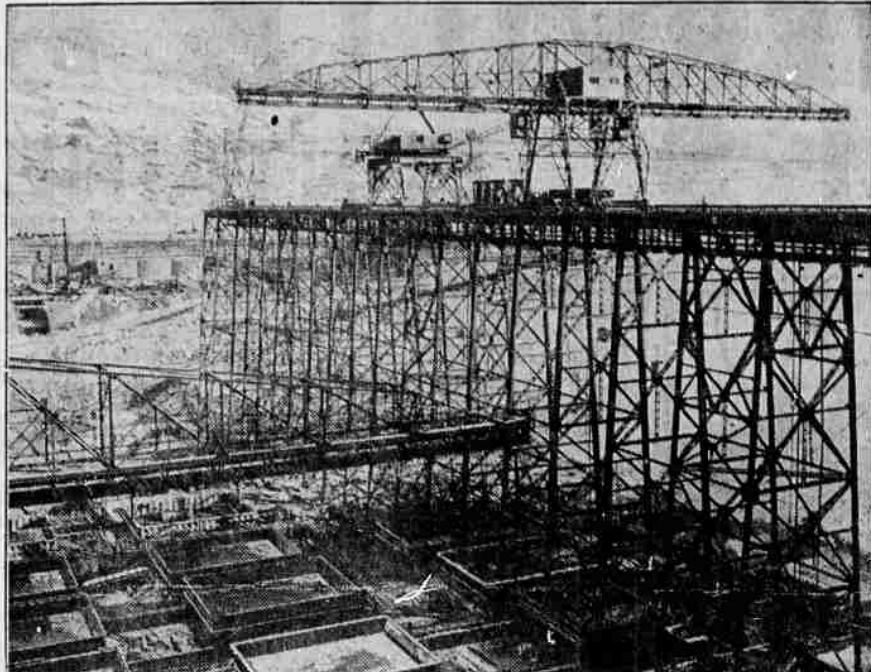


**WINNERS OF OLYMPIC BASKETBALL TOURNAMENT**



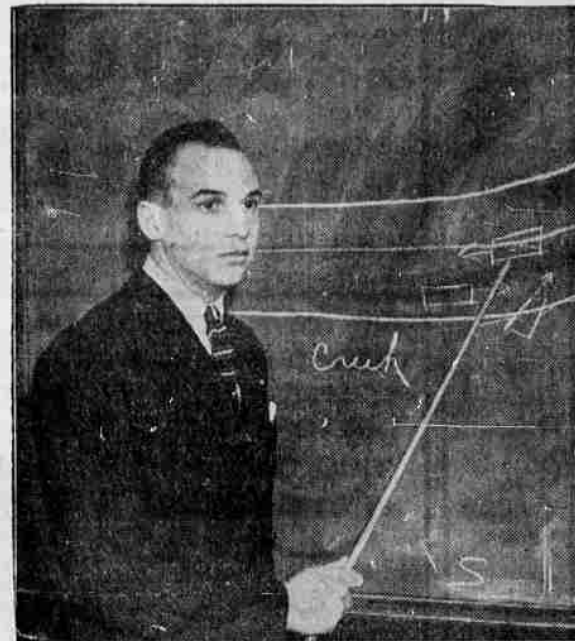

**HUGE TRESTLE SPEEDS GRAND COULEE CONSTRUCTION**

**CAMERA CATCHES DEATH OF STEEPLECHASE FAVORITE**



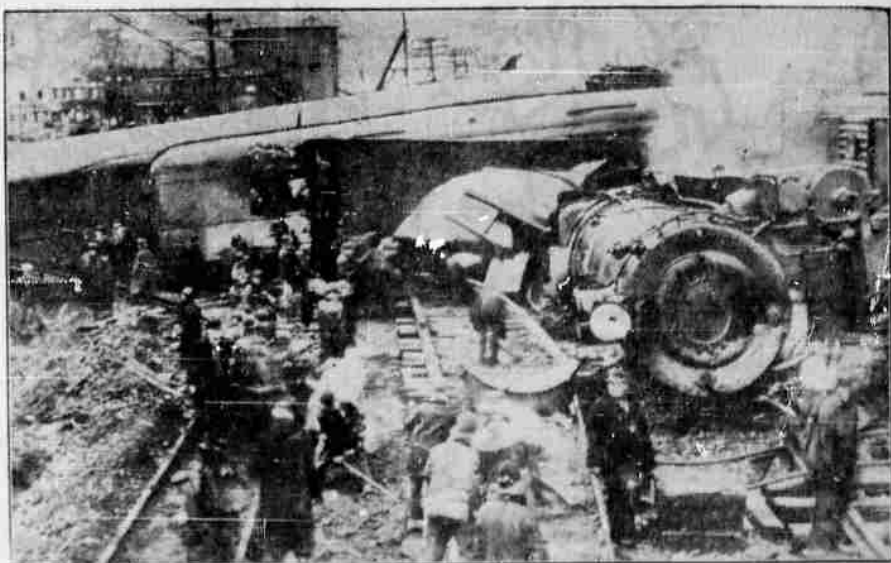

**AIMEE'S DAUGHTER DENIES ROMANCE**



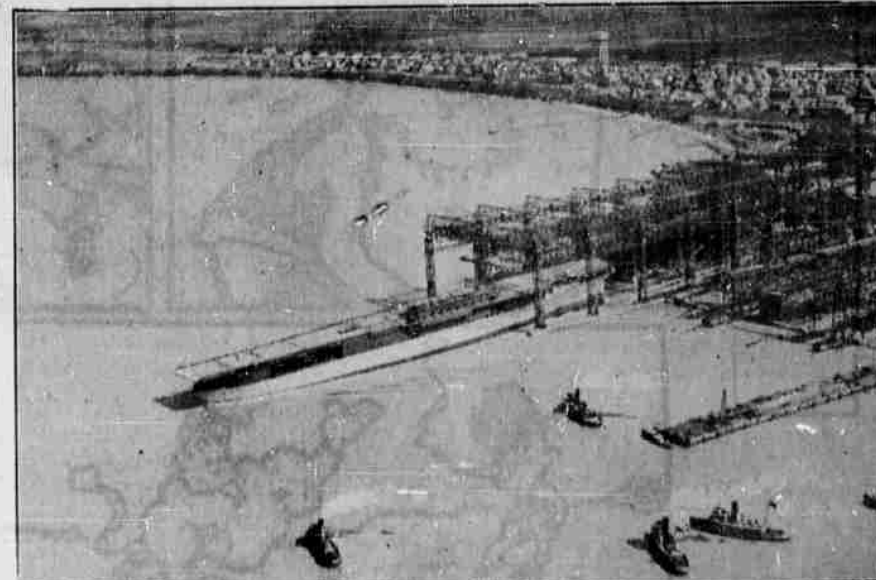
