PECK AND PRINCE VIE TONIGHT FOR CHANCE AT PETE

Winner of Main Event at Armory Will Be Given Match With Belcastro With Junior Title at Stake

An elimination battle between Prince Mihalakis of Arabia and Frankie Peck of Medford and San Francisco for the right to meet Pete Belcastro for the Pacific coast junior heavyweight wrestling championship next week, will be the main event on tonight's wrestling card at the Armory. Both gladiators have had their eye fixed on the title for months, and the ensuing struggle is expected to be one of the greatest seen here.

Mihalakis, after week's rigid training grind, today pronounced himself in the best of shape, and admitted that he will again depend on his two paralyzers, the camel neck and the dragon scissors. Peck, who was satir at dawn this morning to take a tapering-off bicycle ride, will use leg locks and his hawser like headlock.

The middle event pits two All-American football stars for the first time in the history of the Medford ring, when George "Wildcat" Wilson, Washington's great halfback, clashes with Danny Savich, Utah's star running guard. The bout promises to be one of the fiercest, with both men adept at dodging them as well as connecting with them. Wilson's neck, injured in a bout with Peck last week, has ceased to bother him and he has promised to use his tackles freely.

The opening battle brings Bob Kenaston, wild-eyed ex-marine from Gold Hill, back to Medford after a several month's absence, when he meets Frank Taylor, handsome Ohio State athlete. Taylor kicked Kenaston in their last match here when the marine had almost kicked his head off for one fall, and the Gold Hill pride has promised to avenge that defeat tonight.

The curtain rings up at 8:30. The first two matches will be Australian system, the main event American system.
