

PORTLAND YOUTH AWARDED CANTOR EDUCATION FUND

PORTLAND, Ore., April 20.—(AP)—Thoughts which came to Owen W. Matthews, III, 19, at a world boy scout jamboree at Godollo, Hungary, formed the basis of his peace essay that won Eddie Cantor's \$5,000 scholarship.

"I just wrote what I knew," said the Portland high school graduate.

At the jamboree three years ago were boys of his own age from all countries. "Even though we could not talk each other's languages, we made ourselves understood," he said.

"We knew that, no matter what the diplomats of our respective countries might say to each other, we boys had no reason for fighting each other.

"That was the basis of my essay. I suggested that the governments of all countries could well afford to sponsor such international youth conferences, instead of leaving them to a private agency like the boy scouts.

"I believe, and I suggested, that such meetings of your people would do more for world peace than any meetings of diplomats."

Matthews is an Eagle Scout.

The prize was originally awarded to Lloyd Lewis, 17, of Flatland, Mo., but he was disqualified for entering an essay copied from a professor's paper on peace.

Matthews has been working as a messenger for a packing company. He graduated from high school in January, 1935.

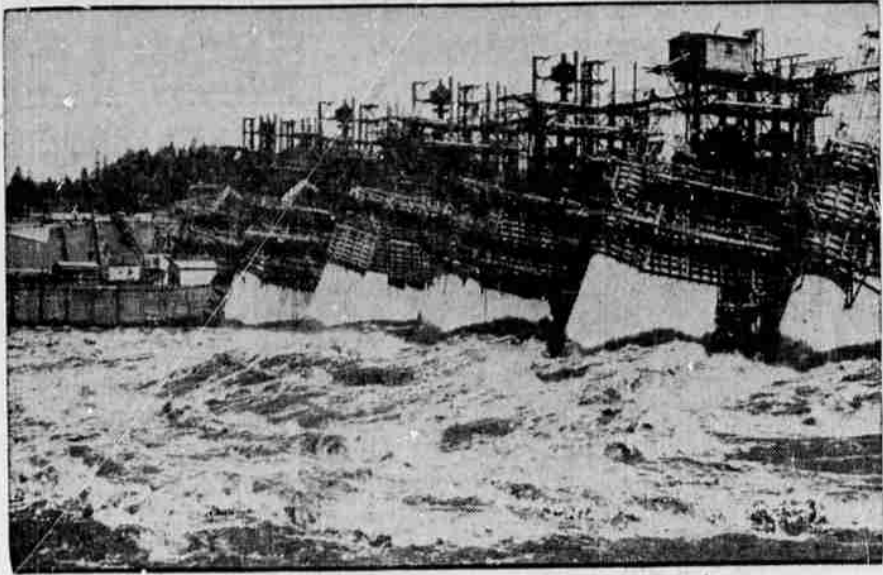

4000-PLANE AIR CORPS GIVEN HOUSE APPROVAL

WASHINGTON, April 20.—(AP)—The house today passed a bill by Representative Rogers (D., N. C.) authorizing an increase of army air corps strength to 4,000 planes. The measure now goes to the senate.

The present authorized strength is 1,800 planes, but war department officials contend the army air corps is far below that figure.

road at the rear and a rail spur is to be constructed for direct loading and unloading, Mr. Samson said. Carl Y. Tengwald, realtor, negotiated purchase of the land.

"We simply have to expand to take care of increased business," Mr. Samson stated. "A new warehouse is absolutely necessary. Our March business showed an increase of more than 100 percent over that of the same month a year ago."

For General Storage

Mr. Samson is engaged in the seed, grain, milling, storage and trucking business at 229 North Riverside ave. He will retain his present location along with the new warehouse, he said.

The new warehouse will be of fire-resistant construction. It will have a modern storage arrangement with individual storage rooms. It will be used for the storage of furniture and other household goods as well as commercial products such as refrigerators, ranges, pianos and radios, Mr. Samson stated. He is already accepting storage contracts for the new building, he added.

FLOOD SLOWS UP BONNEVILLE WORK

BONNEVILLE, Ore., April 20.—(AP) The freshest season put the slow-bell on the \$42,500,000 Bonneville power and navigation project today.

Two hundred men were affected by the initial lay-off, necessitated when the Columbia river passed the 35-foot level and sent water roaring over the top of cribbings on the upstream leg of the new cofferdam.

Contractors said work would be confined to the fish locks, pier tops and the powerhouse structure until next fall unless water recedes markedly before the June peak.

The Columbia stood at the 35.7 foot level today.

Flying Blanket Cause Of Wreck

LA GRANDE, Ore., April 20.—(AP)—A blanket blew over the head of Mrs. Edith Phy of Union while she was driving near Hot Lake, causing her to lose control of her car.
