# FORESTRY YOUTH MIGHT LOSE LEG

James MacLean, forestry student at Oregon State college who has been confined at Community hospital with a bullet wound in his left leg, showed a turn for the worse last night and his father, A. MacLean of Hillsboro, was again called to the city.

Because of lack of circulation, gangrene has shown evidence of developing and it might become necessary to amputate the leg midway between the knee and ankle, the attending physician said.

MacLean was shot accidentally a week ago yesterday at the remote Whisky Peak fire lookout station at the head of the Applegate river on the Rogue river national forest where he was employed for the summer.

# SPANISH CONFLICT WORRIES BRITAIN

LONDON, Aug. 14—(AP)—The British government today looked on the strife in Spain as a possible spark for setting off a general European war.

It took under "urgent consideration" the question of banning the export of civil planes as an aftermath of the departure yesterday of six British aircraft, reported to be destined for belligerents in the peninsula civil war.

In official circles fears mounted that increasing aid by various European powers—in aircraft, money and even reported supplies of guns and ammunition—would prolong the internecine strife in Spain and might easily lead to a general European war through active participation of outside powers.

# PHYSICIAN TESTIFIES GIRL MADE STERILE THROUGH OPERATION

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 14—(AP)—A courtroom occupied principally by feminine spectators heard a physician testify today in the Ann Cooper Hewitt mayhem-conspiracy trial that a test made in January, 1936, disclosed the heiress is sterile. The operation was performed in 1934.

The testimony was given by Dr. Dan Del Prat, a hospital surgical executive. Dr. Samuel G. Boyd and Dr. Tolton E. Tillman are the physicians accused of mayhem and conspiracy in connection with a sterilization operation they are charged with performing on Miss Hewitt.

A result of the operation was a \$500,000 damage suit filed by Miss Hewitt against Dr. Tillman and Dr. Boyd, and her mother, Mrs. Marvyn Cooper Hewitt.

Miss Hewitt alleged she was tricked into the surgery by her mother, in an attempt to gain control of her inheritance from her father, the late inventor, Peter Cooper Hewitt. She contends she was led to believe the operation was only an appendectomy.

# KIEFER TAKES TITLE IN BACKSTROKE EVENT WITH RECORD SWIM

BERLIN, Aug. 14—(AP)—Clocked in 1:05.9, Adolf Kiefer of Chicago turned in his third record-smashing performance, winning the Olympic 100-meter backstroke title today while Holland's quartet captured the women's 400-meter free style relay championship.

The Dutch foursome, Wis Seibach, Catherina Wagner, Willy Denouden and Rita Mastenbroek, led Germany and the United States to the finishing line in that order.

With Kiefer setting the pace, he United States made a strong showing in the dorsal-stroke final. Al Vande Weghe, of Paterson, N. J., listed world record holder at 1:07.4, was second, followed by Masaji Kiyokawa of Japan with Taylor Drysdale of Detroit fourth.

At the end of the four compulsory dives for the 10-meter platform championship, Marshall Wayne of Miami held a slender lead over Erhardt Weiss of Germany, 56-100ths of a point separating the pair. Wayne amassed 46.65 points to 46.09 for Weiss.

loaned Kado 4000 yen, at five percent interest, computed every six months, and payable in one year.

The exchange value of the yen is now 23.38 cents, and Shimoda seeks with interest the sum of \$1,302.34, or 4,836.75 yen.

The agreement, written in Japanese, and translated for the complaint reads:

"I really borrow this money from you, and will surely repay this sum of money by May 11, (eighth year of Showa) 1934, and as security I tender to you 25 shares of California-Oregon Power company stock, and I agree that you dispose of it whenever I break this written promise."

A letter was received from Kado by Shimoda this week, saying he would return to America shortly. George M. Roberts appears as attorney for Shimoda.
