

CANADIAN ARMY TO BE REDUCED AND REVAMPED

OTTAWA, Ont.—(UP) While nearly every other nation in the world is rearming, Canada this year will reduce its army by 45,000 men.

Under a defense program drawn up by Minister of National Defense Ian Mackenzie, Canada's army will be reduced from 135,000 to 90,000, and will be reorganized completely to give the country a compact co-ordinated service in place of the present straggling, loose organization.

Canada's future defense policy will be concerned with four possible developments, Mackenzie declares. They are:

1. Defense of Canada's coasts.
2. Possibility of Canada being compelled at any time to dispatch an expeditionary force to fulfill obligations under the terms of the League of Nations covenant.
3. Defense of Canada's neutrality in the event of war between other nations.
4. Possible dispatch of an expeditionary force consequent upon any contingent developments in relation to Canada's position in the British Commonwealth.

On paper, Canada's military forces consist of 11 infantry and four cavalry divisions. Under Ian Mackenzie's scheme, the forces will be reduced to an actual strength of six infantry divisions and one cavalry division. The 136 militia regiments will be cut down to about 85, and the cavalry units will be merged and mechanized.

The active strength of the non-permanent militia at present is 48,781, but it is divided among innumerable regiments, none of which are up to strength and some almost moribund.

The traditional fighting regiments, with a long record of service, will be strengthened and given adequate equipment and compact administration.

The royal Canadian navy will be reorganized to provide greater opportunities for young Canadians to serve in it.

In addition, the royal Canadian air force will be made more of a fighting unit. Civil aviation operations are to be transferred from the department of national defense to the new ministry of transport and communications, leaving the R.C.A.F. to its real task of training a compact fighting force for defense.

Everyday Cooking Miracles

Take breakfast time, for example, when that new Hubby will be in a rush to get to his office. All the bride will have to do when the alarm clock rings in the morning, is to dress leisurely and then go to the kitchen where, in fifteen minutes, she can have breakfast ready. And this is not all that the modern electric range will do for her. Its Thrift Cooker, which is installed in the cooking top of the range, will

The broiler pan, too, is "extra special." Because of its cover, with a hole in the center, the fat drippings are caught and kept under cover, and burning and smoking are eliminated.

PARIS DANGERS MOUNT AT DUSK

PARIS—(UP)—Late in the afternoon—when drivers and pedestrians are tired and at the ebb of vitality—is the most dangerous time to be abroad in Paris. More deaths from traffic accidents occur between 5 and 8 p.m. than at any other time of day—141 out of 463 for 1935. The least accidents occur at night.

Most accidents are due to fast driving and failure to slow up at crossings—19 per cent. Carelessness of drivers in other respects accounted for 16.9 per cent, and 9.7 per cent were attributed to automobilists who didn't want to cede the right of way
