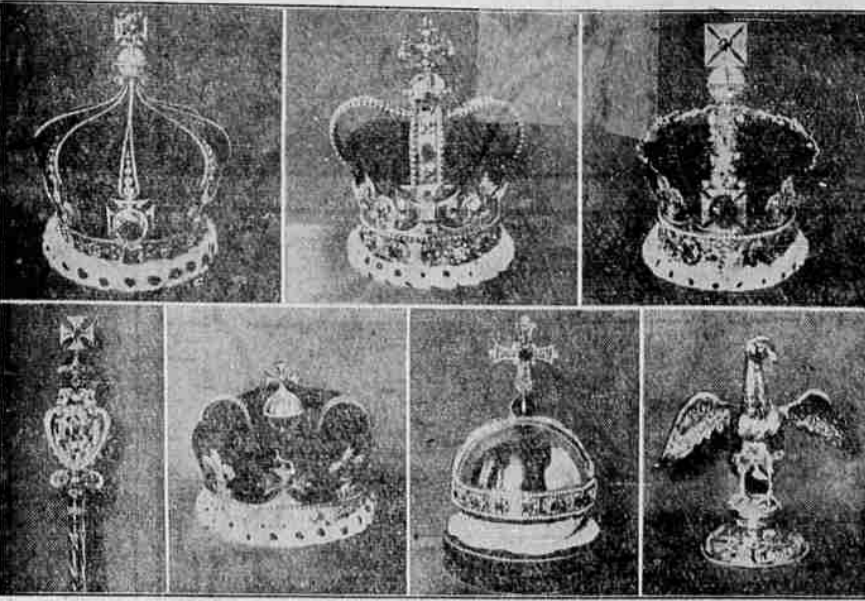
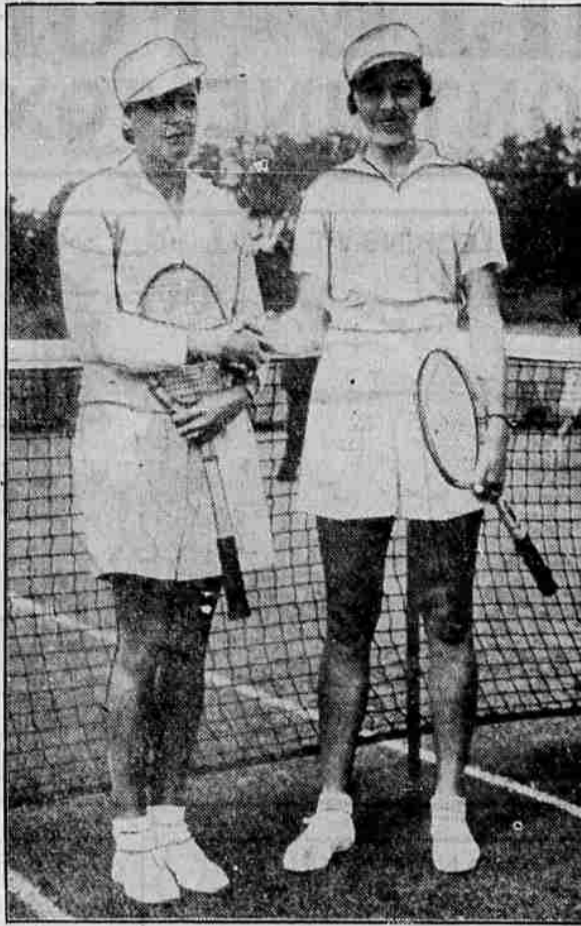


PRIZED CROWN JEWELS AWAIT KING'S CORONATION

Quick Wit Saves Man



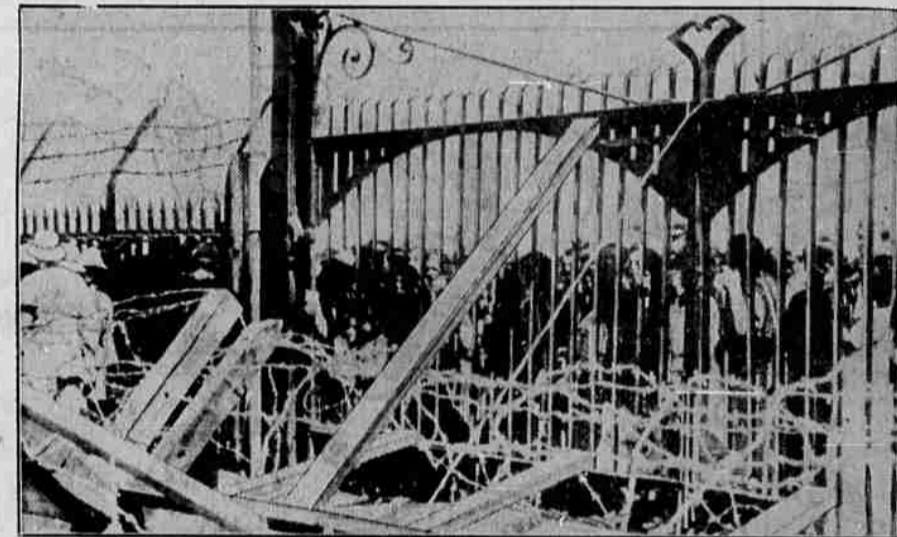

REFUGEES JAM GATES AT GIBRALTAR FRONTIER



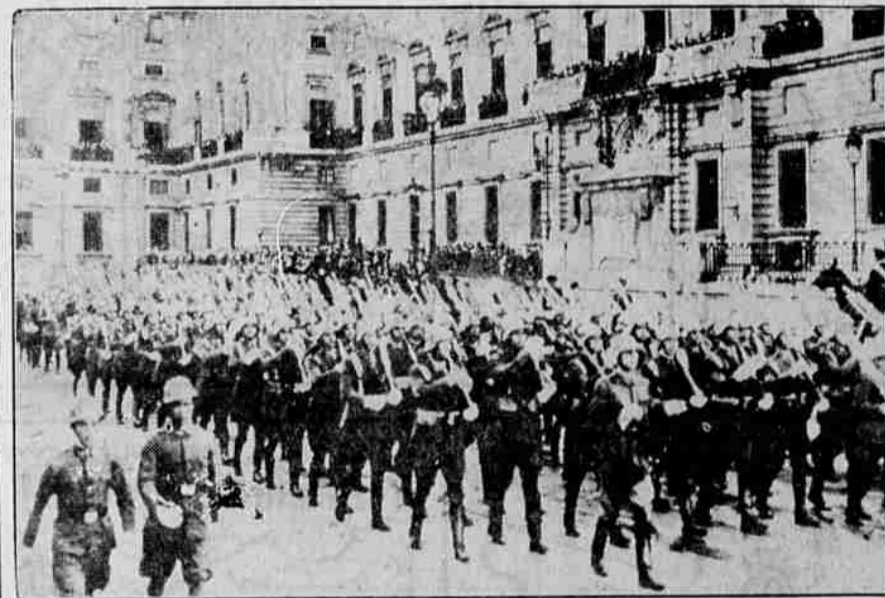
