ADDED FACILITIES AT CRATER LAKE DEPEND ON FUNDS

Improvements Being Made As Fast As Possible, Says Park Head in Reply to Criticism in Newspaper

CRATER LAKE, Aug. 17.—(AP.)—Crater Lake National Park, now undergoing a series of continued improvements, is in line for more in the future although sizeable allotments could be put to excellent use without delay, Superintendent David H. Canfield told the Mail Tribune today.

In speaking of the rim road around the lake, Mr. Canfield said the national park service is planning to have this scenic route completed by or during the 1939 season if funds are available to continue construction.

Short seasons in the park, said Mr. Canfield "retard rapid construction and, of course, the road, although reasonably smooth, is somewhat dusty in its present condition where work is underway, but that is to be expected since it is because of this that the regular daily rim caravans were not offered this season, but visitors are urged to make the trip anyway following another car."

"The park is operated for the benefit of the general public and improvements are largely governed by the needs and requirements of the people, the most potent influence to bring about the realization of needed improvements through demands to the congressional appropriation committee."

"However," Mr. Canfield pointed out, "it is not the desire of the national park service to over-develop its areas out of proportion to public needs. A primary purpose is to preserve a national park in its native state insofar as it is compatible with concentrated use of certain areas by the public. Development is carried on only to provide for the actual needs of visitors, making the park safe and accessible and as a place where the visiting public is urged to come to be close to nature, see rare scenic beauty, enjoy relaxation, and take advantage of services offered."

With the construction of an additional comfort station, a new sign tank for the rim is also planned, Mr. Canfield said. "The present sewage disposal system was inspected last week by Harry B. Mommson, San Francisco, sanitary engineer of the United States public health service, and given a clean bill of health."

Improvements are slated for the water system for the rim, now adequately served by the 190,000 gallon reservoir on the slopes of Gifford peak, several hundred feet above the lodge. The canal system contemplated in the six-year program, a comprehensive plan providing for park development in proper sequence if funds are made available, a new automatic electric pump would be installed, replacing a faithful Diesel engine which would be kept as an auxiliary. While it has never happened, a breakage in the present system would be decidedly inconvenient but it would not cause as great a problem as the recent newspaper article suggested. "In 1931 but not needed until this year was opened this season in the rim campground to aid in providing for the needs of increased attendance. "Increased travel has placed a heavy burden on comfort station facilities at the lake rim," he answered to a query on this phase of public service.
