

Foreign Countries Eagerly Wait Fruit Under "Sun Sugared" Label

MARKET ASSURED FOR FRUIT FROM LEVERETTE UNITS

'Sun Sugared' Brand Takes Public Fancy Says Head of Exporting Firm — Big Export Order Is Booked

Sam Birch, president of the fruit exporting firm of Sam Birch Co., Inc., left Medford last night by train for Portland to start preliminary moves for the exclusive foreign marketing of the packed fruit of Orchard Park Farms, Inc., new plant which started packing last week.

The brand of Orchard Park Farms will be "Sun Sugared." Before leaving Birch declared the new name to be one of the finest for fresh fruit that he had heard in his 40 years of foreign shipping, adding that a campaign carried on abroad last winter has already created an amazing demand for the products, in European markets of all sizes.

"I predict that before the year is out Sun Sugared will be a common name to every fruit distributor in Europe. I spend several months out of each year abroad, and the indications are already for a strong acceptance," Birch stated.

Shipment has started on the first of 105,000 boxes of Sun Sugared pears, to be marketed abroad by Birch. "This will be the first time in five years that we have been able to get enough Medford pears to fill our foreign demand," he declared.

All of the Orchard Park Farms fruit sold abroad will be marketed by Birch, all of the produce being bought for cash, f.o.b.

With Birch in charge of foreign sales, the domestic marketing has also been arranged, according to Walter Leverette, president of Orchard Park Farms. The Thurston Fruit company, one of the oldest fruit brokerage houses in New York City, will handle the domestic program. Thurston has handled large volumes of fruit from this district in the past.

Leverette said, and is well acquainted with local conditions.

The company has built a splendid reputation for f.o.b. sales, and, according to Leverette, will hold auction sales to a minimum. All sales in the United States and Canada will be arranged through the New York firm.

FRANCO-ITALIAN AGREEMENT NEAR ON SPANISH ROW

to keep in readiness for any eventuality.

Her 1800 war planes, reliable sources reported previously, were ready for flight to aid the Spanish fascist rebels in the event France turned down Il Duce's stand for absolute non-intervention in the Spanish dispute.

High sources said if a Franco-Italian agreement was reached in principle Germany would follow the concessions made by Italy and England and Russia would support those concessions made by France.

Thus, it was hoped, the obvious perils of the situation, brought about by the Spanish showdown between a rebel fascist movement and a socialist government supported by extreme leftist elements, would be obviated.

PARIS, Aug. 19.—France will abandon her present position of non-intervention in the Spanish civil war, officials asserted today, if Italy undertakes to aid openly the fascist rebellion against the Madrid socialist government.

"If Premier Mussolini envisages sending arms and munitions to Spain," one official stated, "certainly

the position of France must change immediately."

LONDON, Aug. 19.—(AP)—Great Britain, in a new move to emphasize the need of foreign non-intervention in the Spanish civil war, today clamped a flat embargo on aircraft of any type—both civil and military—to the fighters.

The all-inclusive ban also listed 20 types of war material prohibited for export to Spain.

Authoritative British quarters suggested the possibility that the United States or one of the South American countries might step in as a truce-maker to halt the bloody strife in Spain.

The powers of Europe, the officials pointed out, were too enmeshed in their own political interests to serve as arbiters without arousing the suspicion of favoritism.

HYDE PARK, Aug. 19.—(AP)—Summer whitehouse officials refused comment today on authoritative reports from London suggesting the United States or some South American country attempt to arbitrate the civil strife in Spain.
