AUSTRIA PUTS ARMS INDUSTRY ON SPEED BASIS

Danger of Internal Strife is Believed Heightened by Munitions Race—Army Expansion to Begin Soon

VIENNA (UP)—The Austrian munitions industry is turning out war weapons at an astonishing rate as the struggle for mastery of the nation goes on behind the scenes between Chancellor Kurt Schuschnigg and Prince Ernest von Stuebenberg. Heavy and light tanks, self-guns, planes and machine guns are streaming from factories. No one seems to know or be prepared to tell why. Every Austrian knows that without outside help the country could not withstand a Nazi external invasion for more than a day or two. Its new-found arms, therefore, would seem to mean as a menace against the internal quarreling elements who seek to plunge Austria into civil strife. Socialists, Austrian nazis, fascists, communists and monarchists all hope to profit by the discord and bickering among the nation's leaders. Monarchists probably are the only agitators who will not depend on force. They wish to see Otto von Habsburg return to the throne through Austria's father and not blood-spattered streets. But the nazis and the National socialists, as well as the fascists, are prepared if necessary to fight. Stored in Secret. Each of the militant parties has its secret storehouses of arms.
