Effinger, an electrical contractor who was once an unsuccessful candidate for sheriff in Lima, was described in the affidavit on which the syndicalism charge was based as the "national commander" of the terrorist band of night riders, and as the leader in a proposed armed uprising to seize arsenals and federal buildings. "Chief of Police Ward Taylor of Lima called us this morning and said he was declining to hold Effinger until we filed certain affidavits with him," Chester P. O'Hara, an assistant attorney general, said today.

ROOSEVELT RESTS FOR JAUNT WEST

HYDE PARK, Aug. 22.—(AP)—As Governor Alvin M. Landon of Kansas took the center of the political stage today with his first formal campaign speech, President Roosevelt spent a quiet day at his home here taping off government business. Mr. Roosevelt received his own up-to-the-minute reports on political conditions and Democratic party finances in a conference last night with Chairman James A. Farley and other strategists of the Democratic national committee. Ending up his schedule in preparation for a 12-day trip through the midwestern dust bowl, Mr. Roosevelt socked only one conference for the day—a luncheon appointment with Clarence Dillon, New York investment broker. Tomorrow also was to be a day of relaxation, although the president did consent to allow a committee of women representing the people demand to meet with him to break in with a mid-day conference.

YOUTH AID FUND AVAILABLE SOON

CORVALLIS, Aug. 22.—(AP)—Funds for work aid under the national youth administration will soon be available at Oregon State college and other qualified higher educational institutions this coming year, E. B. Lemon, registrar, has been notified by Russell B. Andrews, deputy state director in charge of college aid. Quotas for the various colleges will be the same as last year which means that \$40,485 will be available for payment in wages to students who otherwise could not attend college. Last year this amount was paid to 456 students throughout the three terms, with an average of 350 students working each month drawing an average of about \$12 per month. Requirements are that students to receive this aid must be in the age group of 16 to 25 inclusive, give promise by past records of scholastic success, and must be dependent on such supplemental aid to attend college. They work on projects of value to the college but which do not replace regular workers.

INDUSTRY GAINS, NEARS OLD PEAK

NEW YORK, Aug. 22.—(AP)—Recovering from last week's setback, the tempo of industry was moved up to within a fraction of the peak touched two weeks ago. The Associated Press index of industrial activity closed this week at 98.7 percent of the 1929-30 average, compared with 95.1 (revised) last week and 79.7 in the same period a year ago. Automobile output was stepped up sharply as Ford went back into production after a two week lay-off. Steel mill operations continued to surge ahead in the wake of an early July dip as miscellaneous takings of all kinds remained at a high level.
