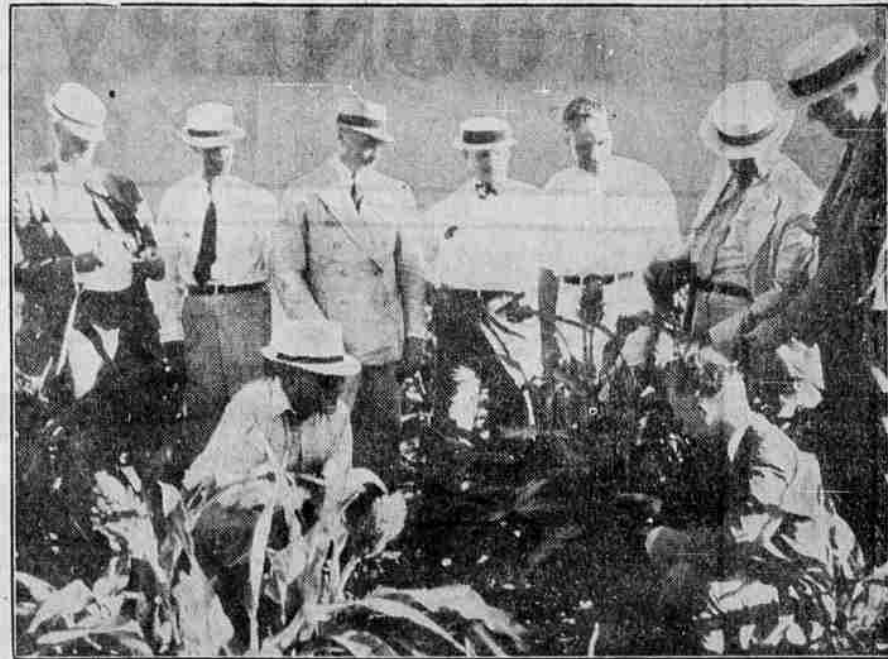

COLONEL KNOX AT PLAY



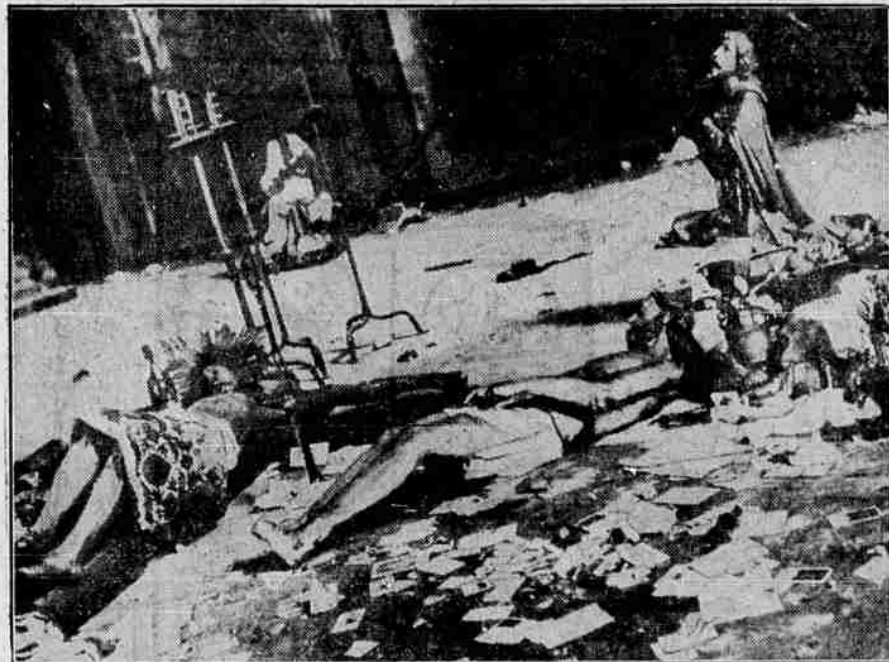

COMMUNISTS WRECK SPANISH CHURCHES



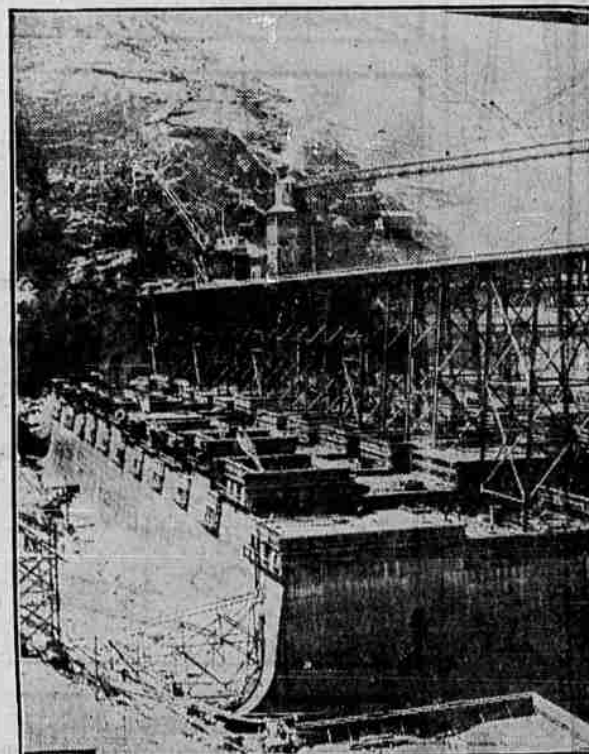
