

DRAMA INVOLVES AIRPLANE RACERS ON FLIGHT WEST

Kansas City Pilot Makes
Safe Bail-Out When Plane
Explodes — Amelia Earhart
Has Plane Trouble

KANSAS CITY, Sept. 4.—(AP)—Drama involved two contestants in the transcontinental Bendix air speed race today as they shot westward from New York toward Los Angeles. Joe Jacobson, 31, Kansas City, parachuted to safety when his Northrup Gamma plane exploded near Stamford, Kas., after he had flown from New York to Kansas City at a speed exceeding 195 miles an hour.

Amelia Earhart Putnam, famed trans-oceanic woman flier, battled a flapping emergency door on her westward flight to Kansas City, with a loss of time she estimated at 40 minutes or more.

Chute Jump Fatal
At Los Angeles, the air race opened with a fatal accident today when L. C. Faulkner, San Diego parachute jumper plummeted to his death. A strong wind kept Faulkner's parachute nearly closed during his leap of several hundred feet. He died a few minutes after being removed from the municipal airport.

Benny Howard, Chicago, favorite to win the race, landed here at 9:30 a. m., after a flight of 4 hours, 54 minutes from New York. He took off 16 minutes later, and said he planned no other stops on the 1,421-mile flight to Los Angeles.

George Pomeroy, of Washington, D. C., landed at 5:09 a. m. (Central Standard time). He took to the air again at 8:20 a. m. (Central Standard time.)

Louise Thaden and Blanche Noyes required 7 hours and 17 minutes to reach Wichita. They landed here at 11:13 a. m. for fuel and were away at 11:32 a. m. (CST).

Miss Ingalls Trails
Laura Ingalls trailed her feminine competitors into Wichita by only a few minutes, landing at 11:43 for refueling. She took off again at 12:04 p. m.

William (Buster) Warner and his crew of three landed their Vultee plane at Albuquerque at 10:32 a. m. (Mountain Standard time)—the first of the air race entries to halt at the southwestern city, approximately 600 miles airline from Los Angeles.

Jacobson telephoned a report of his experience to Gale Enos, a friend, at the airport here.

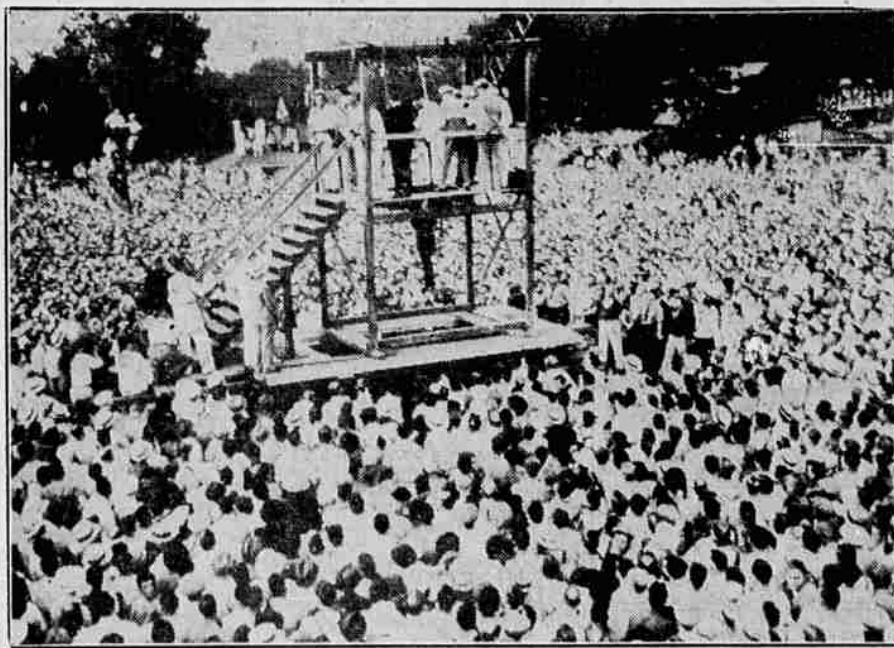
"Gale, I've had some terrible bad luck and some good luck," he said. "I was flying at about 5,000 feet when suddenly the plane exploded. It felt like someone had hit me in the face."

"I was thrown clear of the plane. I pulled the rip cord of my parachute and the lines tangled and fouled. After falling some distance, the parachute opened and I landed unhurt."

GOOD CONDITION SEEN IN STATE UNIT REPORT

The World war veteran's state aid commission, of which Col. E. E. Kelly of Medford is a member, has issued a financial statement as of September 1. Col. Kelly was notified today. An unusually healthy condition of financial affairs is shown, he said.

Bonds outstanding total \$23,875,000 as against outstanding loans receivable of \$13,314,375.47. Realty contracts receivable total \$1,457,316.89, and \$4,375,922.35 is invested in state owned property. The state aid sinking fund totals \$2,397,880.44, and the

state aid fund \$152,917.39, bringing the total assets to \$23,697,110.71.
