

Robert Taylor, Barbara Stanwyck In Leading Roles Craterian Film

ROMANTIC PAIR IN DRAMATIC PICTURE OPENING RUN TODAY

The screen's newest romantic team, Robert Taylor and Barbara Stanwyck, is at the Craterian theatre where "His Brother's Wife" starts a three day run today.

Taylor, the most sensational box office draw since Clark Gable first leaped to fame, is rapidly becoming known as the first real matinee idol of filmdom since the days of Rudolph Valentino. His following is not confined to one age group, but numbers little girls in sun suits (or is that as definite as it might be?) to grey-haired grandmothers, who see in the handsome young star their dreams come true. But, and herein lies the secret of real, lasting fame, Taylor is also well-liked by the masculine element.

The story of "His Brother's Wife" tells of a young scientist about to embark on his first scientific expedition. On the eve of leaving New York for the tropical jungle, Taylor goes on his final fling, and meets Miss Stanwyck in a gay gambling casino. For ten days their romance progresses and Taylor decides to forsake the expedition and remain in New York to marry Babs. He is dissuaded from doing so by his brother, (John Eldridge), and he accompanies Jean Hersholt, leader of the group, into the jungle.

Meanwhile, to avenge herself, Babs marries Taylor's brother and when the young scientist returns to New York, he finds her "his brother's wife."

How this complicated situation is finally brought to a satisfactory conclusion forms the climax of the story. Among those featured in the supporting cast are Joseph Calleia, Samuel S. Hinds, and Ted Prouty.

GOV. LANDON LEADING 2 TO 1 IN LITERARY DIGEST'S FIRST POLL

Landon leads Roosevelt by over 2 to 1 in the first scattering returns from four eastern states in The Literary Digest's nation-wide presidential poll.

The combined vote in Maine, New Jersey, New York and Pennsylvania, from which ballots are reported in a copyrighted article in the current issue of the magazine, shows 16,058 votes for Landon and 7,645 for Roosevelt.

Lemke polls 754 of the total of 24,689 votes tallied which is fractionally over 3 per cent.

The Socialist candidate, Thomas, receives a total of 109 ballots and the other four minor candidates divide 125 votes.

Landon's lead is greatest in Maine, where he gets 1,831 to Roosevelt's 522 votes.

New Jersey voters sent in 2,660 ballots marked for the Republican candidate and 1,621 for the Democratic nominee.

The early returns from New York show the President trailing with only 2,724 votes to his opponent's 5,931. Pennsylvania, which was one of the

six states to give Hoover a plurality four years ago, now ballots 5,634 for its native son, Landon, and 2,778 for Roosevelt.

The Literary Digest cautions in its editorial columns that these returns are meager and should not serve as a base for any extensive predictions of the final outcome. The magazine also points out that none of the ballots in its first poll report came from the large metropolitan areas of New York City, Philadelphia, or Pittsburgh.
