Jagow said he had given the warrant to State Police Officer Robert Herr to serve on Burdick, who is being held at the Westport police station.

Tonight the prosecutor said he had set the bail for Burdick's release at \$100,000 and sent a policeman William Trippe to the hospital as a guard over the injured man until the bond is posted.

Byram, former president of the Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Paul and North Pacific, is a patient at the St. Joseph's hospital, a bullet wound in his head. His physician, Dr. Harry E. Phillips, of Westport, said the elderly millionaire's condition was not critical.

Sergeant Irving T. Schubert, who is directing the state police investigation of the shooting, said Byram was in a motor car on the way to Mrs. Frances Evans, 40, of New York City, Planned Fourth Marriage.

Schubert said he understood the marriage would have been the railroad magnate's fourth matrimonial venture and asserted Mrs. Evans told him she was divorced from a former naval officer, Charles H. Byram.

The state police officer said Byram, lying on his hospital bed this morning, accused his son-in-law of attempting to take his life.

LANDON CALLS FOR LABOR DAY FREE FROM PREJUDICES

Should Remain Steadfast In Belief Concern Of All Is Kansan's Proclamation.

TOPEKA, Kas., Sept. 5-(AP)-Monday was proclaimed a labor holiday with "no room in it for class divisions and prejudices" by Gov. Alf Landon today as he planned a presidential campaign with Herbert Hoover.

To "the people of Kansas" the Republican candidate issued a "formal call" to a Labor Day of "good will and friendly association" saying:

"We should remain steadfast in the belief that the concern of labor is the concern of all; that labor should be free to organize for fair consideration of its rights to organize and promote such consideration must remain forever free from governmental or any other form of coercion."

Hopes to see Hoover "No good citizen," he added "would contribute to class divisions and prejudices."

Coincidentally with issuance of the proclamation the nominee told a press conference that "I hope to see" former President Hoover "on his way home" from an eastern trip. Before leaving San Francisco last night, Hoover told of a telephone conference with Landon and his intention to speak in the Kansas's behalf.

Landon interrupted a morning crowded with state business and campaign plans which included a telephone conversation with John Hamilton, national chairman, to hold his customary press conference. He came into an outer office crowded with photographers' floodlights and stood as he talked with reporters. As the outset, he was asked about Hoover's statements.

"I talked to Mr. Hoover Wednesday," Landon said. "Mr. Hoover said you are mobilizing your forces," a newsmen remarked.

Reticent on Call "I talked to him," the nominee repeated, turning away. "Did you call Mr. Hoover or did he call you?"

"I've discussed that already." A few minutes later, after Landon had discussed plans for a trip to Wichita Monday and a Labor Day talk to the State American Legion convention, he was asked whether he expected to see Hoover during the campaign.
