

ARGUMENTS SET IN SUITS AGAINST WORK INSURANCE

Arguments will be heard tomorrow in circuit court, on the motion of the Pinnacle Packing company, five other local packing plants, and Leonard Carpenter, a fruitgrower, for a temporary restraining order, prohibiting the State Unemployment Compensation commission, from collection of levies and enforcement of the law, pending the determining of the legal attack of the packers upon constitutionality of the law.

Both suits are based upon the alleged unconstitutionality of the unemployment compensation law. The packers further aver it is "discriminatory," and that they are exempt under the "agricultural exemption clauses."

TREASURY OFFERS NEW BOND ISSUE

WASHINGTON, Sept. 8.—(AP)—Government fiscal experts cooked an eye toward investment quarters for 1937, awaiting reaction to a \$914,000,000 offering of treasury bonds. Of the total, \$400,000,000 of new 20-23 year 2 1/2 percent obligations were offered for public subscription to put new money in the treasury's cash box and up to \$514,000,000 were offered in exchange for 1 1/2 percent notes maturing September 15.
