

DRAFT NEW LAWS IN DRIVE AGAINST ORGANIZED CRIME

Firearms Act Will Require Revolver Purchasers to Register — Court Action Will Be Speeded Up

WASHINGTON, Sept. 10.—(AP)—Government attorneys are forging new weapons in what they describe as a drive to combat America's costliest foe—organized crime.

Since the 75th congress adjourned last June 20, Brian McMahon, assistant to Attorney General Cummings, and aides have been drafting new legislation for introduction in the next congress.

Topping the list is an amendment to the national firearms act which would require every purchaser of a revolver or automatic pistol to register with the bureau of internal revenue.

Register Purchasers
All purchasers of machine guns, sawed off shotguns and silencers must register, but small firearms purchasers are exempt.

Recent invention of a high powered revolver, capable of wounding an automobile engine with one bullet and already offered on the open market, "emphasizes more than ever," McMahon said today, "the need of regulatory legislation."

High on the justice department's list of "desirable" bills is a measure to abolish appeals in habeas corpus proceedings.

Speed Court Action
"The purpose of this bill," McMahon says, "is to prevent the long delays, in some cases two years, in the government's attempts to have defendants removed from one federal district to another for trial in the federal courts."

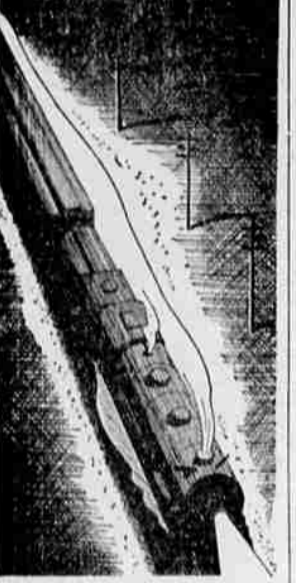
Another measure would require defendants intending to use defense attorneys to give the prosecution advance notice. The purpose of this bill, McMahon says, is to prevent perjured alibis by giving government agents a chance to check on them in advance.

Under a fourth measure awaiting introduction in congress an iron hand would be given G-men in dealing with extortionists.

'SUN SUGARED' PEARS TOP GOTHAM AUCTION AT AVERAGE OF \$2.44

Thursday morning's New York auction market saw the first car load of Sun Sugared pears from the newly-organized Park Farms, Inc., topping the market, it was learned yesterday by Walter Levetite, president of the corporation. Registration for the fall term at Southern Oregon Normal school in Ashland was started Tuesday afternoon nearly a week in advance of the formal opening. President Walter Redford stated that the early registration is expected to relieve pressure on the registrar's office and student councilors and will enable regular classes to get under way more quickly. The plan is particularly recommended for students living in or near Ashland, Redford added.

New instructors have been secured to take the places of four regular members of the faculty who have been granted leaves of absence. Albert VanAver, grad. rate of Reed college in Portland and Claremont college in Claremont, Cal., will fill the

place of Angus L. Bowmer, dramatic and English instructor, who left recently to spend the ensuing school year studying in New York City and England.

Miss Lucille Burtis, who will study at Columbia university in New York, will be succeeded this year in her position as art instructor by Nan K. Wiley, University of Oregon graduate.

Mrs. Bertha Smith, assistant professor of health, will also spend the year taking additional studies at Columbia university, and Mr. V. D. Bain of the social science department, has accepted a temporary position with the state department of public instruction. Successors to Mrs. Smith and Dr. Bain have not been named by President Redford as yet.

No figures on probable enrollment are available as yet.
